Hartford was known as "Mr. John" to the thousands of A&P employes. He frequently visited as many as 3,000 of the company's stores in a





Shepperd Defends New Election Code

AUSTIN-(P)-Texas' new election law gives party officials new power to make sure only loyal members vote in its conventions and seek nominations in its primaris. says Secretary of State John Ben

He suggested the State Democratc Executive Committee seize upon this new latitude and fortify the law with strict rules including "more stringent requirements for qualification of its party members." Shepperd's suggestions were made

The secretary denied the new law can be used to destroy the Democratic Party in Texas. He said it gives the executive committee power to strengthen the party.

Critics have charged that the code provision saying "any qualified voter" could participate in a Democratic precinct convention would open the doors to Republicans or Dixiecrats. They charged the provision permitting a person's name to appear on the ballot twice






