Loss Of Hill Is Bitter Blow To Tired Gl's EIGHTH ARMY, KOREA-(AP)-A savage Red coun-

terattack Monday hurled American infantrymen off the highest peak of "Heartbreak Ridge" in Eastern Korea.

The Americans had gained control of the peak late Sunday night. Three doughboys-remnants of a platoon (about 40 men)-had stormed to the top. Reinforcements came up fast and threw back a Red charge.





Gen. George C. Marshall is one of the most completely selfless public servants the United States ever has had. His high sense of duty, coupled with a truly illustrious record of achievement, stamps him unquestionably as a great American.

He was the designer of victory in World War II. And after the conflict his was one of the few voices raised against the too-hasty demobilization of U.S. forces.

As secretary of State, he conceived the Marshall Plan of economic aid to foreign countries and laid the groundwork for the important North Atlantic alliance. These are acknowledged to be the most imaginative strides in American foreign policy in many a day.

When a storm of criticism swept Louis Johnson out of the Pentagon last Fall, President Truman called on Marshall to come out of retirement to become secretary of Defense. Putting aside personal wishes, the general responded. In his year as top defense official, he helped mold America's Korean forces into the finest professional army this country has ever had. More than that, he fought gallantly for universal military training to assure the nation a permanent pool of expert fighting manpower.

Yet, like any other human being, Marshall has made mistakes. He has been involved in the most controversial aspect of U. S. foreign policy-the Far Eastern phase. His postwar mission to China has been severely attacked, ing defeated Italy entered. WASHINGTON -(P)- Premier licide de Gasperi of Italy Monday told Congress a united Europe would be able to take care of its own de-

"Europe once solidly united," the 70-year-olr premier said, "will re-lieve you of your sacrifices in men and arms, for she will herself contrive the defense of her peace and common freedom.
