## Defense Department Spending

For the next several years the nation's military expenditures promise to be extraordinarily large. This year's appropriation finally came to \$57,000,000,000. Reports from the Pentagon point to a considerable step-up in 1952

Since you and I pay the taxes that supply this money, we have an obvious stake in seeing that it is well spent But under the procedures which now prevail, that virtually

The reason is simple. Congress lacks the experts to judge what is a fair outlay and what is not. Budget making in this age is a highly complex business, calling for much more than just financial skills. It requires understanding of the technical problems of a given department, a grasp of broad governmental policy, an appreciation of the way one phase of policy blends with another.

Nowhere is the difficulty greater than in the Defense Department. A knowledge of weapons, of tables of organization, of all the myriad details of the armed services' housekeeping activities, is something to be acquired only after long contact and experience.

Perhaps a few lawmakers can be said to have that experience: men like Chairman Vinson of the House Armed Services Committee and Representative Engle, Michigan to the Vatican and have concluded letter, dated Oct. 3, 1950, signed by Taft's election, harassed and harried diamonds. ### **Ousied Collector's** Tax Returns Come **Under Prober's Fire**

WASHINGTON -(P)- A federal tive sideline activities and a dispute over his own income tax deductions—touched spurs Friday to an audit of the tax returns of the Internal Revenue Bureau's 56,000 workers.

John B. Dunlap, commissioner of Internal Revenue, testified that an audit of Marcelle's tax returns showed he had claimed unsubstantiated income tax deductions and understated his income a total of \$32.834 since becoming collector in 1944. Marcelle's tax returns never before had been audited, Dunlap

Marcelle conceded he "was ver careless" about his own taxes. He testified that his net worth when he went to work for the bureau was name. In 1948, four years later, he said, his gross income was \$135,-776.58, mostly from outside business ventures.

Denies 'Connivance

He insisted it was "without any connivance of mine" that his 1948 tax return, the biggest he ever filed, was routed into files reserved for individual returns on income under \$8,000. These usually are not audited by revenue agents.

Dunlan said he was pressing for "a complete audit" of the tax returns of bureau employes for the last three years, "including myself," and would go back farther "if it seems indicated."

The study in Marcelle's case showed the former collector had underestimated his 1948 income by \$11,419, and had claimed unsubstantiated deductions totaling \$23,097, partially offset by an unclaimed allowance of \$1,682, Dunlap added.

He said such a case, if it involved "a private citizen," probably would not be pressed for criminal prosecution, but that efforts would be made to collect the taxes believed due. He did not say whether this would be the procedure in Marcelle's case.


