According to a study we saw this week, the population of America's this study is two years out of date. This includes those incarcerated in the country's 50 federal prisons,
600 state prisons, and 3,900 county and city jails.
At the time the count was made,
the states of California and Texas were running neck and neck for the lead in prison population. California had just over 37,000
inmates, while Texas' count fell just under this figure
Looking beyond the prisons and
considering all forms of
correctional finds that 2.4 million people--more than one per cen of under some type of correctional care, custody or supervision. This comes out to 1.2 per cent of all adults over
one in every 45 adult men.
Prison numbers are growin
much more rapidly than the meneral more rapilation. nationwide prison population
doubled between 1973 and and has risen another 25 per cen since 1983.
In 1983 , the rate of incarceration
was 177 per 100,000 .his was the was 177 per 100,000 . This was th
highest rate since the government began
1925.
The increase in prison light of the fact that the national crime rate has shown a decline
