Canadian Navy Plans Discharge Of Pseudo-Surgeon

OTTAWA -(AP)- The Canadian Navy Tuesday prepared to discharge an American who posed as a Ca-nadian doctor and served brilliantly as a surgeon in Korea. The man's father doubts he ever went to medical school

The Navy Monday announced the man they enlisted as Dr. Joseph Cyr of New Brunswick is in reality 29-year-old Ferdinand Waldo Demara. Jr., formerly of Lawrence.

The Navy's "Dr. Cyr" won considerable fame for a series of major operations he performed on Demara said as far as he knows the only previous medical experience his son had was as an orderly in a Boston eye and ear infirmary. The father said he hadn't seen his son since about 1943. He described him as "bright to the point of genius" and said he once studied in a Trappist monastery.

New Brunswick's only Dr. Joseph Cyr, of Grand Falls, reported his medical identification papers disappeared last Winter. Newspaper accounts of the Navy man's surgical exploits aroused comment in New Brunswick and resulted in Demara's return to Canada for investigation.

Navy announced Demara would be discharged in "due course" for fraudulent entry into the service. Canadian immigration authorities also are investigating whether he entered the country illegally.
