"We have reached agreement in so far as the wording is concerned," Rear Adm, Arleigh A. Burke, UN Command subcommitteeman told correspondents. "The only thing

left now is for the liaison of-+= ficers who are working on the map to finish."

Agreement on the buffer zone issue came at the twentyninth I subcommittee meeting in Panmunjom.

If the agreement is approved by the full truce delegations, as expected, negotiators would have 30 tough problems-supervision of the armistice, exchange of war prisoners and recommendations to the belligerent governments.

Pighting will continue in the war, now 17 months old, until all of these points are settled.

Maj. Gen. Henry I. Hodes, chief UN Command subcommitteeman. indicated the full five-man delegations could meet Sunday to approve the buffer zone agreement

1. Allied and Communist subommittees agreed Friday on a buffer some clause.

2. Staff officers began charting the fighting line on a map. This will be the proposed military demarcation line and the center of a planned two and one-half-milewide buffer sone.

3. The map drawing is expected to be finished Saturday afternoon (Friday night in the U.S.). The littee then must approve

4. The full five-man delegations must OK both the clause and the map. This is expected quickly.

5. The full delegations then move on to the three remaining armistice clauses: (a) Supervising the truce, (b) Exchange of prisoners. (c) Recommendations to governments on withdrawal of for-

eign troops.

6. If the whole job is done within 30 days, the line which staff officers are drawing will be the line where the shooting stops. If it takes more than 30 days, the line will be changed to the battle line existing when an armistice is

7. The fighting will continue until an armistice is signed. 8. Truce negotiators first met July 10. The buffer zone is the only armistice clause they've negetiated.




