



"What is meant by control of a bridge hand?" asks a Danbury correspondent. Control is difficult to define, but you always know what it is when you've just lost it. That usually happens when you run out of trumps so that the opponents can take too many tricks in the side

In today's hand, for example South lost control of the play. It wasn't his fault, however. Just keep



your eye on East and see how he waited for the right moment to strike the decisive blow

West opened the king of diamonds and South ruffed with the six. South next led the eight of hearts towards dummy's king, hoping to land in dummy for the club finesse

East let dummy win the trick. If he took the ace of hearts, East could return a diamond, but South would discard instead of ruffing. West would take the second defensive trick with the ace of diamonds and return a spade.

Dummy would win with the ace of spades to lead a club. South would take the queen and ace of clubs and ruff a third club in dummy. East could then over-ruff for the third defensive trick, but the rest would be South's.

When dummy won the second trick with the king of hearts, de-clarer took the club finesse, cashed the ace of clubs, and ruffed a club in dummy with the five of hearts. Once more East bided his time. He refused to ever-ruff.

If East makes the mistake of overruffing, South makes the contract. East returns a diamond, and South discards. West takes the ace of dia monds and returns a spade. Dummy wins and returns the seven of hearts, and East can take only the

When East refused to over-ruff declarer returned the seven of hearts from the dummy. This was the moing. He stepped up with the ace of hearts and put dummy in by returning a spade

Now declarer couldn't get out of dummy except by ruffing a spade or a diamond. This brought him down to one trump, while East still had two trumps. South then discovered that he had lost control of the hand.

For years, women have accepted certain perfume problems as in-evitable fly-in-the-ointment factors cessary to the ownership and use of fragrance. Such things as deterioration, spilling and a certain amount of waste seemed to be insoluble difficulties.

Now, by borrowing a simple pharmaceutical technique, one perfume manufacturer has provided an answer to many of these problems. This firm seals the scent in tiny gem-like capsules, each of which contains just enough fragrance for single application.

Because the capsules are hermetically sealed, evaporation and chemical deterioration are impossible makers claim. This eliminates the dregs that so often form in fragrances that have been too long in

are no closures to come loose. The perfume is released by hold ing the capsules end-on and squeezing gently. The liquid-1/30 of a dram-flows out into your palm or onto your handkerchief, ready


