





Drive Scared!!

"Don't let death take your holiday-or anyone else's" is an appropriate slogan of the National Safety Council as it appeals to the nation to keep the millionth traffic death from being a tragic Christmas present to some American family.

The millionth victim, at the present rate of traffic deaths, is expected to die sometime next week-almost at the height of the Christmas season.

As Ned H. Dearborn, president of the Safety Council, says, "It is bitterly ironic that the gaiety and festivity of the Christmas season should provide the backdrop for one of the most tragic events in the nation's motor vehicle

It must come as a shock to motorists to realize that in only 50 years the lives of almost 1,000,000 men, women and children have been squandered in one of the most senseless and deplorable wastes of modern times.

Even more shocking perhaps than the toll itself is the fact that few persons feel any real personal concern over six tricks in his own hand, so might this problem. There is no escaping the fact that personal concern and personal concern alone can postpone the millionth traffic death until after the holidays.

Mr. Million's fate is approaching right on schedule, despite a nation-wide campaign to delay it. We hope the fatal accident which claims the life of Mr. Million will not happen on Midland streets or on West Texas highways. That is one "honor" West Texas does not need. We as individual motorists must make up our minds to do all-we possibly can to prevent this mockery of all that Christmas stands for. It is up to us as individual motorists.

The National Safety Council recommends that motorists "start driving scared," and perhaps that is not such a bad idea after all.

The "driving scared" suggestion doesn't mean putting your car in storage, or quaking with fear to the extent that you become hesitant and indecisive at the wheel. A too-fearful driver easily may contribute to an accident by his erratic behavior.

The recommendation has to do with the kind of "scared" that makes one realize the life-and-death responsibility of driving in modern traffic. Driving scared would keep motorists from going too fast. They wouldn't pass unless there was plenty of room, nor drive after drinking, nor follow other cars too closely. They would keep a sharp lookout at intersections and grade crossings.
