### Arthur Capper, 86, Kansas GOP Leader, Dies Of Pneumonia

TOPEKA, KAN, -A- Arthur Capper, a Kansas Republican who served in the U.S. Senate three decades, died Wednesday night at the age of 86.

Capper retired from politics three I recent months, his health had

Capper, who started newspaper work as a printer's apprentice at \$1 owned two daily newspapers and eight farm magazines with a combined circulation of 4,500,000.

The newspapers are the Topeka Dully Capital and the Kansas City, Kan., Kansan. He also owned two

He was a leader in farm legislation during his years in Congress. He frequently was referred to as the Republican voice of the Mid-

west farmer.

Children were his main hobby, although he had none of his own He lent hundreds of thousands of follars to farm youths through the Capper "Pig and Calf Clubs," which gave youngsters a chance to own their own livestock. He also es-

tablished a crippled children's fund. For more than 40 years he gave birthday anniversary party in Topeka for children of the county The parties were atterfied by thousands.

Capper served two terms as Kansas governor before being elected to the Senate in 1918.

A sister, Mrs. A. L. Eustice of Evanston, Ill., is his only survivor. Funeral arrangements were in-

### Reds Talk 'German Unity'

At first Stalin's puppets in East Germany spurned a United Nations invitation to Paris to discuss a proposed commission for inquiry into free election prospects in Germany. Then the Kremlin changed its mind, and the East German Communists dutifully decided to appear.

This might mean that Russia still recognizes the UN 43 a powerful influence among the peoples who yearn for peace. Or it might indicate only that Moscow has reassessed the propaganda debits and credits and feels there is more to be gained by having the German Reds come

It clearly does not mean that the chances for a unified Germany under a freely elected government suddenly have gone up. Russia has no intention of allowing unfettered elections in the eastern zone. The Communists would be voted down overwhelmingly, just as they would be thrown out tomorrow if the Red Army and the commissars went home.

To the Soviet Union, the unity issue is a weapon in the tireless campaign to disrupt the West's plans to incorporate West Germany economically, politically and militarily into the Allied family.

The upside-down language of its East German stooges necks to block the corruption deals. at Paris is proof of its total insincerity on this question.

Dr. Lothar Bloz, deputy premier of the puppet government, described the UN plan for a commission of induiry on free elections as a Western scheme to block unity. Here we see the tattered old device of trying to tar your enemy with the black that belongs on you.

The President has been most considerate in consulting Mrs. Truman on the slightest decision he might make which could cause her inconvenience or change her plans. She in turn has unselfishly gone along with everything she considered best for the career of her husband.

Today, after six and one-half years of experience Mrs. Truman makes a very presentable First Lady. She has just had a modist new short hair-do. She has dieted with success, to achieve a very trim figure for a woman of 66. She dressconservatively but in very good

She makes a passable short speech of welcome or thank-you. and can present an award as graciously as anyone. She knows how to smile just at the right time for photographers. And she can hide a yawn with the best of them.

However, despite her having mastered the First Lady modus operandi, it is also no secret that she has played the role of the reluctant First Lady ever since her husband took the oath of office.

While efficiently going through the motions of the frequently tedious and stuffy social and official routine forced on the wife of the President, her heart has always been with the women's bridge club of Independence, Mo.

As much as she could Mrs. Truman has kept White House social life to a bare minimum. Some say she deserves credit for this. In a town that has gone social and cocktail-party crazy since the war, she has kept the dignity of the White House intact. And she has kept aloof from frantic, alcoholic party mood which has gripped the na tion's capital since 1940.

It is also a fact that she welcomed the need to rebuild the White House mansion as a great blessing in disguise. Having to move into the cramped Blair House gave her the perfect excuse to cancel even the most traditional White House social functions







Most of those whose campaigns for funds have not produced as much as needed are continuing their drives. In almost all cases when figures quoted here were compiled, only a few more thousand dollars were needed.

More often than not the fund raising campaign is coordinated by the Community Chest. In other cities, similar work is done under other names, such as United Fund Drive.

Corpus Christi is in a unique situation this year. Its city agencies have combined their appeal for funds for the first time. They set a goal of \$544,735 and so far have taken in \$452,000 with the cam-

paign still progressing. Fort Worth, for the sixth straight year, oversubscribed its goal. This weekend, pledges to the Community Chest were \$671,164.


