



Honest Clean-Up Desired

President Truman's plan for reorganizing the Internal Revenue Bureau is understandably drawing a skeptical response from some congressmen.

He is here reaping the reward of too long refusal to acknowledge widespread corruption within his administration. For months he either laughed off the wellfounded charges or sought to dismiss them as nothing more than cheap political attacks upon him.

At a recent news conference, he set a new low in insincerity, not to mention presidential manners. In defiance of the fact that congressional inquiries and press sleuthing had unearthed much shocking information, the President baldly claimed full credit for taking the initiative against government wrongdoers. He lashed out crudely at the press for daring to contend otherwise.

Earlier in the tax scandal story. Truman was doubtful that it would do any good to take the revenue bureau out of politics. He took an attitude which suggested the proponents of this scheme were mere amateurs in statecraft.

He now is recommending that very course. He would abolish the 64 politically named district revenue collectors and establish 25 new divisions, all under civil service. Only the top bureau commissioner would be appointed by the President. He also would boost bureau salaries to lessen the temptation to seek supplementary income outside.

The Hoover Commission on government reorganization proposed a roughly similar plan more than two years ago. This group hardly can be classified as amateur. Which System To Choose?

There is a hitch, however, as to what system of communications to adopt. The U.S. favors a very high frequency omni-range system, called stalled throughout this country. VOR gives a practically static-free

signal easy for pilots to receive. The British, however, are looking a Decca system which was developed and is owned by Bing Crosby's Decca Records Company. It has been installed as a marine navigation air in European waters since

the war. It has given good service there. But aviation men claim it is cumbersome to handle on aircraft and its signal is subject to atmospheric

disturbance. Even after agreement is reached on which system to adopt for European airways, there will be some delays in getting the necessary installations. About 50 stations will have to be equipped, and cost of

each installation is \$40,000 to \$60,000. There is one German electronics company which could make the necessary VOR ground apparatus. But the armistice agreement prohibits Germany from making air-

borne electronics equipment. Considering the high priority on all U. S. electronics equipment for the defense effort, there seems to be little chance of getting American equipment for a European VOR sys-

tem, or even the Decca system Unless, of course, the loss of the U. S. transport in Hungary makes it now seem advisable for the American government to furnish air navigation equipment for all of Western Europe, as part of the Mutual Defense Assistance Program


