

+ Here's the complicated situation:

A rescue train still has one and one-half miles to go to reach a highway where it will pick up the passengers.

A highway crew still must open one and one-half miles of Highway 20 to reach its nearest point-onehalf mile-of the stranded train.

The weather was moderating, at least temperarily, and an SP spokes. man said all passengers will walk

The SP spokesman quoted Dr. Lawrence Nelson, Truckee, Calif. who reached the train by dogsled, as reporting all passengers were able to walk to the highway. He said those made ill-variously reported at 27 to 60-by gas fumes two days



We Have Yielded Enough

It has been some time since Communist negotiators at Panmuniem have offered a significant concession, or in fact any proposal at all.

In recent meetings, the United Nations conferees have been doing all the conceding, almost to the point of endangering the Allies' future military security on the Korean peninsula. This has been done in the interest of indicating our firm desire to reach a settlement, to prevent the talks from bogging down.

For example, we have abandoned our demand for aerial inspection over North Korea during an armistice period, and have agreed to limit troop rotation (the Reds wanted it halted altogether).

But if these concessions are not to be matched by similar yielding on the Communist side, there can be little hope of further significant progress in the truce parleys. As one UN negotiator stated, we have not come to Panmunjom to arrange for the destruction of our forces.

The Reds are stalling, clearly awaiting new instructions from higher authority - possibly Moscow. Meanwhile they fill the void with insulting epithet.

Soviet Foreign Minister Vishinsky's suggestion that the UN Security Council try to help bring the talks to successful conclusion may provide one key to the delay. 



Tuberculosis Can Be Stopped; **Get Fast Medical Treatment**

By EDWIN P. JORDAN, M. D. Written for NEA Service

Until tuberculosis is entirely eliminated from our society it is helpful to know that treatment also has culosis germs and unless a person is made such great advances that most victims of the disease can be saved and restored to comfortable and nseful lives.

The main principle of treatment of tuberculosis of the lungs (and other forms of the disease, too) is rest. The patient with lung tuber culosis usually must go to bed and stay there for a long time. Relief from worry and mental strain also is important.

This collapses the lung and allows it to rest until re-expansion seems safe. A person can get along well means a dangerous procedure. This palities involved. The Air Force treatment is called pneumothorax. Several surgical treatments for

tuberculosis also are useful. These are aimed at giving the diseased tissue a chance to rest completely. Several methods are used, including in difficult cases, the drainage of pus from tuberculosis cavities and even the removal of some diseased lung tissue.

Some of these measures, however still are experimental. As further knowledge is gained about them they should make it possible to save some patients with advanced tuberculosis of the lungs now considered hopeless.
