Engineers recommend for economy and safety reasons that fourlane highways be built to accommodate stretches carrying more than 4,000 vehicles daily.

"We have 1,000 miles of road with such traffic where four lanes should be built," the commissioner said.

The Odessa-Midland highway now carries 14,500 vehicles daily, more than the Fort Worth-Dallas Thoroughfare.

E. H. Thornton, Jr., is chairman of the Highway Commission, which includes R. H. Potts of Harlingen and Wemple. The Midland good roads champion has one more year to serve and he isn't seeking reapintment, which would set a preceient for recent years.

Wemple realizes the current needs of the highway department. He knows 12 1/2 per cent of the 16,000mile primary road total in Texas has passed its normal 20-year life expectancy and that fully half is more than 10 years old. Ten per cent of the bridges in the primary system are too weak to hold legal loads and half either are too narrow or spanned too low to accommodate modern traffic.





What does this mean? Well, for one thing it means the PCL has taken the first, if short and unsteady, toddling step toward eventual big league baseball. It also means a lot of changes will be made in that league's brand of play and in its dealings with the major leagues.

First off, just what is the open classification? It's a league higher than triple A ball and one step below the majors.
