No. 1 Erwin indicated a reef discovery lime discovery Saturday. It took a one hour and 20 minute drillstem test at 7,530-65 feet. Gas surfaced in three minutes and oil started spraying at the top in five minutes. The flow of oil was steady and regular during the last one hour and five minutes. It was during that period that the well made the 10 to 15 barrels per hour flow. There were no signs of formation water. The flow was through a one-half-inch tubing choke.

Deep Lea Opener Cores More Pay In Devonian Zone

Buffalo Oil Company No. 12-B Bash, flowing discovery from the Devonian in Central-West Lea County, N. M., is at total depth by electric log survey, of 13,573 feet, and operator is preparing to squeeze cement behind casing. A ten-foot core, taken from 12,568 to 13,578 feet, by drillers measurements, was taken. Recovery was only one foot. That one foot had good oil stain, porosity and fluorescence. No signs of formation water were present. After the core was cut, operator ran electric log surveys and changed total depth from 13,578 to 13,573 feet. Top of the Devonian was corrected to 13,548 feet and casing point to 13,554 feet.

I Can Beat Harry, Declares Kefauver

Senator Kefauver (D-Tenn) confidently predicted Sunday he could win the Democratic presidential nomination even if President Truman seeks reelection.

But he said he does not think Truman "wants the job" again. Kefauver said on a radio (CBS) program he is not running for second place, and if Truman runs again and offers his backing to Kefauver for the vice presidential nomination, he would not "be interested at all."

Senator Maybank (D-SC) declined to tell newsmen on a television show whether he would support Truman if the President is the Democratic nominee for reelection. He recently said he was opposed to Truman, and would support Senator Russell (D-Ga.).

Maybank told interviewers on the NBC "Meet the Press" program his support would depend on the vice presidential nominee and the party platform in the event Truman ran again.

Senator Taft (R-Ohio), first Republican to announce for the GOP nomination, Sunday would not comment on a resolution designed to get his name entered in Oregon's primary in May.

The Oregon State GOP Committee passed a resolution Saturday aimed at getting Taft to test his strength in that state. Taft said in Cincinnati he would have nothing to say on the matter "for some time."

In Washington, political sources said Republicans backing Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower for president soon will make known his recorded views on taxes, labor, farm and many other domestic issues.

They are combing through his speeches, letters and memoranda as background for the campaign document. Eisenhower himself has been silent on the issues, and although announcing he would accept the nomination if it is offered him, he said he will not take any part in campaigning.

Party confidence in eventual victory in the still-distant election was expressed by leaders of the two parties:

Guy Gabrielson, chairman of the Republican National Committee, said on an NBC-TV program he believed any GOP candidate could lick any Democrat.

Frank E. McKinney, Democratic national chairman, said in Detroit: "Our record and the sorry record of the Republican Party are the surest guarantees of a Democratic victory."

years of 1930's, Ickes was head man of the Public Works Administration, overseeing—sometimes down to the last penny—more than seven billion dollars worth of public building.

He once referred to Thomas E. Dewey, Republican presidential candidate of 1944 and 1948, as "the candidate in sneakers." He called Wendell L. Willkie, the GOP candidate in 1940, "the simple, bare-foot Wall Street lawyer."

Of himself, Ickes once remarked: "I've known for a long time that I'm not loved with the fervor to which I'm entitled. If a man worked hard at it he couldn't get a bigger list of enemies than I."

When Ickes resigned from President Truman's cabinet, he said he no longer could stay and "retain my self respect." Cruz of the dispute was the President's nomination of Edwin W. Pauley, an oil man, to be under-secretary of the Navy, vigorously opposed by Ickes, the nomination later was dropped at Pauley's request.

After his resignation, Ickes authored a syndicated column and a magazine series. His name continued to be linked with public issues, although in recent years he grew comparatively quiet.

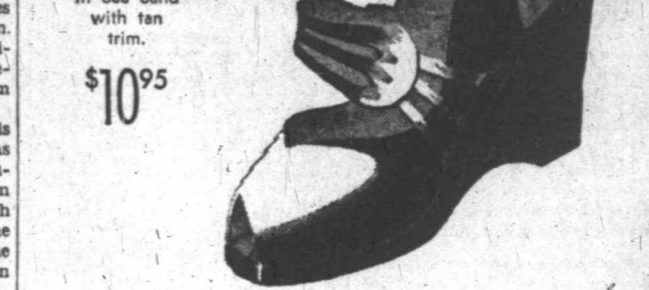

Five Dead, 12 Hurt In Apartment Blaze

OMAHA—Five persons died and 12 were injured, one seriously, in a flash fire that routed 40 persons from the Liberty Apartments, near downtown Omaha, Sunday night.

The dead, four men and one woman, were found in their rooms by firemen. One body tentatively was identified from papers as that of J. Lesnovich, a railroad pensioner. Identification of the other bodies was not possible immediately because of their burned condition.

The cause of the fire was not determined, but Arson Squad Capt. Dan Mulcahey said it apparently started on the top floor of the two and one-half-story brick and frame structure and spread rapidly.

Most of the occupants of the 38-unit building already had retired when the fire broke out. Firemen took some out of windows on ladders. Others, scantily clothed, jumped. Some made their way to the outside by fire escapes.

George Anderson, 52, who suffered a fractured ankle and possible broken back, said at the hospital, "I said a little prayer before jumping." He jumped from the top floor.

Mulcahey said the bodies were found on the top floor near where the fire was believed to have started. He said the victims apparently ran to the corridor, found it filled with fire and smoke, returned to their rooms and were trapped.

One of the bodies was part way under a bed. The other body in that room was sprawled across a bed. Captain Mulcahey said. Both were those of men, who appeared to be young.

The other three bodies were recovered in separate rooms nearby. Louis Allbright, about 60, was listed as most seriously hurt of those hospitalized. Allbright was overcome by smoke and suffered from exposure.

One of the injured, Mrs. Rovida Bennett, said she was awakened by her husband, who smelled smoke. They tried to escape through the door, she said, but found the corridor filled with choking smoke. Firemen later helped them to safety through a window.
