### Rubber Prices Snapped Back When U. S. Took Over Buying

By PETER EDSON NEA Washington Correspondent



WASHINGTON-The story of how General Services Administrator Jess Larson and his aides lowered the price of natural rubber from 80 cents a pound to 50 1/2 cents isn't as well known as it should be. It makes a pleasant variation to the usual pattern of steadily rising prices in this inflationary age.

This deflation has been year. Not only has the price been lowered. The chaotic world rubber market has been stabilized and the supply of raw rubber now has been built up to the point where there is enough for both military and civilian needs.

Before war broke out in Korea. rubber sold at around 50 cents a pound, dockside in the U.S. In the five months that followed, with every major power in the world scrambling for rubber, the price shot up to 80 cents.

U. S. government buyers for the Munitions Board stockpile found themselves bidding up the price and competing against buyers for the privately owned American rubber taxpayer millions of dollars because rubber for national defense orders.
