Britain and the world generally mourn the death of a friendly, kind and devoted monarch—King George VI of England—who gained the respect and admiration of peoples everywhere during his 15-year reign.

Yet, at the same time, British subjects and the peoples of other nations hail the young Queen Elizabeth, the first woman to rule Britain in 51 years.

Blessed with the same qualities for winning the affection of people that her father had, Elizabeth ascends to the throne already assured of a warm place in the hearts of her subjects.

The queen not only is popular with the British public, but she and her consort are popular with Americans, with whom the royal couple made a tremendous hit during their recent visit to the United States.

To the poor Briton, upon whom "super-austerity" measures recently have fallen even after more than 12 years of shortages and belt-tightening, Queen Elizabeth brings hope of better times in Great Britain.

Queen Elizabeth takes over when the affairs of the British Empire are at a particularly low ebb, when its golden days have faded and when its strength is challenged in many places.

But the monarchy still exists, and as the new queen mounts the ancient throne, Britons, although saddened by the death of George VI, hope that somehow the advent of a queen may bring better times.

Down through the years, it seems, Britain has grown in strength and stature and conditions have been more prosperous under the rule of a queen. That perhaps is another reason why the British people now hail the new Queen Elizabeth with stout and encouraged hearts.

Queen Elizabeth, perhaps more than anyone else, is aware of the tremendous responsibility which goes with the crown she now wears. But undoubtedly she will face the responsibility as a real queen of the people over which she now rules.

Elizabeth's training for her future role was intense although not rigid, and she was prepared for the day that arrived with her father's death. The late king had trained his daughter well for the queenship.

Throughout the free world the prayers and hopes are that Queen Elizabeth will rule long, successfully and happily over Britain and the dominions overseas.

It's Hard To Build Platform 'Tailored' To Any Candidate

WASHINGTON—Efforts to smoke out where Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower stands on every political issue overlook one important factor. This is that if General Eisenhower should get the Republican National Convention's nomination for the presidency, he will have to take whatever platform the party adopts at Chicago.

He will have to run on it, and he will have to like it, whether he agrees with every plank or not. This makes the fight over drafting that platform a hot political gladiator's battle. There will be all kinds of sparring for positions on the resolutions committee.

Taft, Warren, Stassen and Eisenhower factions will be anxious to get control of the chairmanship, the full committee and the subcommittees assigned to work out various sections. In the past, every state has had one delegate on the resolutions committee. The committee elects its own chairman.

The committee works long hours and late at night. Knocking Out Splinters Often it assembles a week before the convention proper, to get a head start by hearing from all the special pleaders for Israel, Ireland, the gold standard, a tax on bachelors, prohibition, the 13-month calendar, anti-vivisection, a high tariff on imported jelly beans and other assorted causes.

The Hon. Robert A. Taft was chairman of the GOP Resolutions Committee in 1944. He eliminated himself from the 1948 committee chairmanship because he was a more active candidate for the presidency. Senator Henry Cabot Lodge was chairman in 1948. But Senator Lodge is chairman of the national Eisenhower for President campaign.

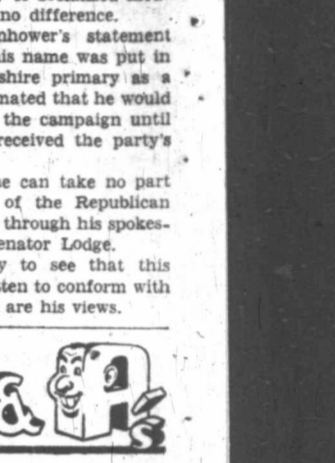
