The City of Midland started looking Friday for an industry which needs 3,000,000 gallons of water daily.


The city will have that much to spare as soon as its new sewage disposal plant southeast of Midland is completed.

FORT WORTH -(P)- Murder charges were filed here Friday against Robert H. Barber, 26, and his blonde wife, Doris Faye Barber. 21, in connection with a gun battle Thursday at their home which claimed the life of Detective Henry E. Cleveland, 50.

FORT WORTH -(AP)- H. E. Cleveland, 49, veteran Fort Worth detective, was killed and two other officers wounded Thursday in a gunfight with an ex-convict wanted for questioning in a \$15,000 Dallas robbery.

Fort Worth, was in a critical condition from a gunshot wound in the chest. Dallas Detective H. C. Holloway,

39, suffered a wound in the leg. Robert Hugh Barber, 27, who twice has served prison terms, was wounded four times. A fourth detective, T. O. Pope, 43, Dallas, was not injured.

The four officers went to Barber's four-room home here to question him in the robbery of Burt's Cafe in Dallas, January 2. Four armed men held up customers and carried off the safe. Two men have been arrested and charged.

WASHINGTON - (P) Ellis Gibbs Arnall, Georgia's plump little ex-governor, Friday was headed for a big new job as the nation's price boss-a job he labelled "tough, unpopular and thankless."

President Truman sent to the Senate Thursday the nomination of the 44-year-old Southerner to be director of the Office of Price Stabilization.

Several senators predicted little or no opposition to Arnall's confirmation for the \$16,000-a-year post. Arnall would succeed Michael V. DiSalle who is quitting February 15 to seek the Democratic nomination for the U.S. Senate in

No Senate Opposition Chairman Maybank (D-SC) of the Senate Banking Committee tentatively scheduled hearings on Arnall's nomination next Tuesday Maybank said he knew of no opposition at this time.

Friends of Arnall said they took his acceptance of the OPS job to mean he is convinced, in his own mind at least, that Truman will seek reelection. They represented him as being unwilling to accept "an unpopular job" for a short

In Atlanta, Arnall told newsmen: "I have no extrordinary ability, am no economist and know of no

But, he added that he is willing to undertake the difficult job of price chief to help "preserve our conomic stability and our nation's security."
