

Yet when they hold these rich prizes in hand they too often act as if they did not value them at all.

Men fight fiercely for freedom when they do not have They fight, too, when they see it ebbing away, or under immediate and grave threat.

But when the danger to their liberties recedes even slightly, they relax their guard and turn a deaf ear to all pleas for militant action.

This puts them at a definite disadvantage in any contest with Communists, to whom militancy is a way of life. Thursday in the Crystal Room of In the Communist world, there is no room for relaxation. The Cause is an around-the-clock tyrant commanding the believer's energies every second.


