



Experts Uncertain On Effect Of Comic Books On Children

MILAN, ITALY-(P)-Experts on children from 25 nations says comic books and cowboy movies affect the tots, but they admit they don't know how much or in what ways. Meeting under United Nations nsorship, 600 educators, jurists and other authorities ended a fiveday session here with the conclusion that "little is known" of the effect of thrilling adventure stories in young people's reading, movies and radio programs.

A majority of speakers conceded a need for such excitement. The judicial section, however, urged gov-ernments to bar children from films considered harmful to their education and reduce attendance of children at movies generally. A section studying publications proposed that publishers who meet suggested standards be authorized to use a special mark on their books and magazines The experts had been







The young victim, James Stanley Leedom, a freshman at Seattle University, was one of 40 volunteers participating in the project seeking better ways to preserve whole blood. He died three days after the injection, despite every effort to save his life.

Dr. Robert H. Williams, head of the University of Washington De-partment of Medicine, said the blood became contaminated "by some phenomenon" after it had been refrigerated "The only way we can explain

it," said Dr. Williams, "is that the bacteria was able to grow in some manner while the blood was at freezing temperature and not at body temperature." Both Dr. Williams and Dr. Clem-

ent A. Finch, associate professor of dicine in charge of hematology at the university, said they would "gladly participate in the same experiment tomorrow. They said the bacteria had not






