





## 'Eggbeaters' Do Little Bit **Of Everything**

FORT HOOD - The versatile helicopter, which does a little bit of everything from saving human lives to destroying insects, is getting a new military "shakedown" in Exercise Long Horn, the most extensive mock war in this nation's history.

Top Army echelons had asked: "Just what are military capabilitles of the 'flying eggbeaters'?" And they called upon the Sixth Helicopter Transport Company of Fort Sill, Okla., to furnish the

The 115,000-man maneuver was only a few hours old when the Sixth Helicopter outfit, composed of nine Bell H-13's, dent into action. A unit of the 47th Infantry Division was surrounded by the green-clad "Aggressor" 82nd Airorne Division when Maj. Gen. Norman E. Hendrickson, commander of the 47th, ordered the unit supplied by helicopter until they could either break out of the pocket or reinforcements arrived It was decided that the unit would be evacuated by the 'copters if there was no other method of

The complete supplying of a unit - everything from water to ammunition-by a helicopter com-pany was something new in Army maneuvers, officials reported. In fact, many new military uses of the helicopter are planned before the maneuver ends on April 11. Traffic Directed

The provost marshall will use the Bell machines to direct traffic, throughout the 60 mile long, 30 mile wide maneuver area. Public address systems will be mounted on the H-13D's and used for psychological warfare. Advance parties, scouts and reconnaissance teams will utilize the helicopters of the Sixth Transportation Company. And the rotory-winged craft will be utilized to spot cleverly camouflaged 'Aggressor" in-
