



There have been many strange interludes in Washington during the last seven years. But never was there a sorrier spectacle than the Newbold Morris-J. Howard Mc-Graft affair. The dignity of public office suffered deep offense in consequence, and the American people must have few regrets that these two men now have been vanked unceremomously off the national stage.

Morris, President Truman's cleanup investigator, was the lesser offender. His chief difficulty seemed to be that he is unsuited temperamentally for life in today's chaotic capital. From his own personal standpoint, maybe that is good. But from the public's, it is not.

Morris' investigation into corruption appeared ill- z starred from the beginning, when charges of many sorts started flying his way the moment he was named.

The motive's of the senators who assailed him may not have been wholly pure. They may have wanted to discredit Morris so his inquiry would fail and the corruption issue would stay alive until election time.

However that may be, Morris lost his poise and ballance under this assault. He could have defended himself in a soberly mature manner that might well have shamed his critics. Instead he lashed out in a flailing counterattack that understandably aroused widespread indignation in the Senate and elsewhere.

Morris, plugging ahead anyway, showed marked courage; but it was not the disciplined courage of the man who carefully has gauged his adversaries and knows where and how to hit them. He quickly dissipated any shance he had of doing a good job.





Each year, thousands of people buy Easter Seals to support the National Society for Crippled Children and Adults. But few of the generous citizens who each year for the last 30 years have helped to support this voluntary organization really know how their dollars are

The society gives direct service to 228,000 crippled children and adults each year. Facilities and services for the handicapped operate in all 48 states, the District of Columbia, Alaska, Hawaii and Puerto Rico.

Almost 2,000 professional workers are employed to give service to the handicapped, including both children and grown-ups. One hundred and fourteen out-patient treatment enough electricity to operate the training centers are maintained for cerebral palsied and crippled chil- 62 days.



National Assembly Backs Pinay's Plans For French Defense

PARIS -(A)- Premier Antoine Pinay won his no compromise fight Tuesday night to finance France's 10 billion dollar budget without new taxes. The National Assembly approved his plans in a series of 10 confidence votes.

Final vote on the budget as a whole, which provides almost four billion dollars for France's war in Indochina and her contribution to North Atlantic defense, was 311 to

Pinay had said he would resign unless all nine of his proposals and the entire budget were approved.

The parliamentary outcome was good news for France's partners in North Atlantic Treaty Organization. The Assembly had voted down proposals by two previous governments to get the 1952 budget money, raising grave fears that French inability to pay would wreck the NATO program.

Instead of new taxes, Pinay plans to get the funds by stringent economies, and "pitiless pursuit" of future tax frauds coupled with a pardon to those who have cheated on taxes in the past.

The budget now goes to the Council of the Republic, Parliament's advisory upper house. With no special difficulties expected there, it probably will be voted finally later this






