

He feels that America's "land generals" have blocked the adoption of such a policy. He clearly believes that proper stress upon air power will do away with the need for a large land force and that the net result will be sounder and cheaper military security.

Now there probably is not a competent "land general" in this country who would deny the dominant role of air power in any future war. And certainly the air generals would like to see a vast expansion of their forces for both offensive and defensive use.

## Guatamala Land Reform Measure **Becomes Effective**

GUATAMALA, GUATAMALA (P) — A Communist-backed land-re-form law which permits the government to break up large holdings for distribution among farm workers, went into effect Wednesday. President Jacobe Arbenz Tuesday night signed the controversial measure he had sponsored. It received

Congress approval last week.

The law permits the government to expropriate land from present owners and make it available to farm workers on a lease or pur-chese basis. It does not apply to farms of less than 225 acres and to large plantations producing export

Owners of expropriated land are to be paid in 25-year governmen

Opponents complained the law was Communist-inspired. It will not apply to the United Fruit Company of Boston.


