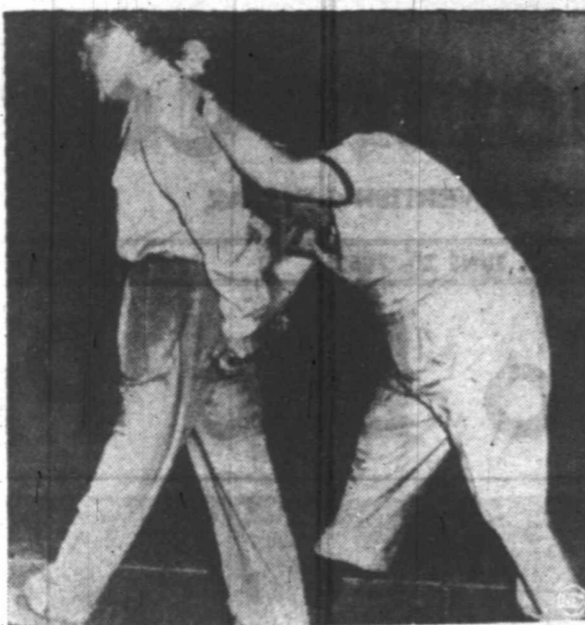
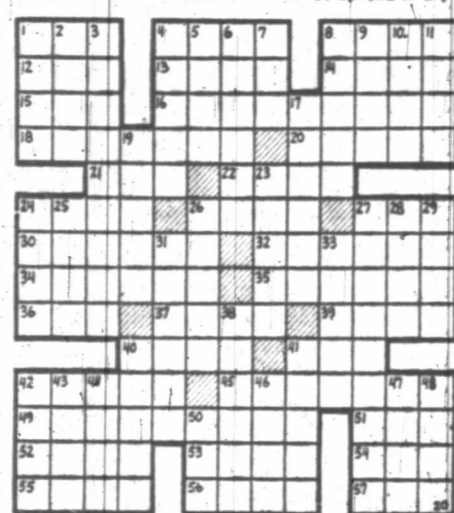
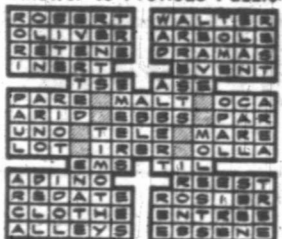

WASHINGTON — (AP) — OPS has just authorized price ceiling increases for baby and "junior" foods. The increases range from 3 1/2 to 8 1/2 cents a dozen cans or jars, at the factory.

The agency estimated the retail price will rise by about a cent a can for canned baby meats, but not more than half a cent a can for other baby foods. The increase reflects increased transportation and wage costs in the industry.

Allies Return To Parleys Saturday

MUNBAN, KOREA — (AP) — Allied negotiators return to the Korean Armistice conference Saturday, 23 p.m. Friday night, to learn if their second walkout has convinced the Communists to change their minds.

The meetings at Panmunjom have been stalled almost two months by Communist refusal to accept the Allied declaration that 100,000 Red war prisoners do not want to go back to communism.

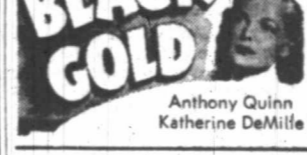
Groucho Marx Sets Return To Stage

ALDERSHOT, ENGLAND — (AP) — All that talk about mothers home cooking being so good is the bunk, says a British Army expert on food.

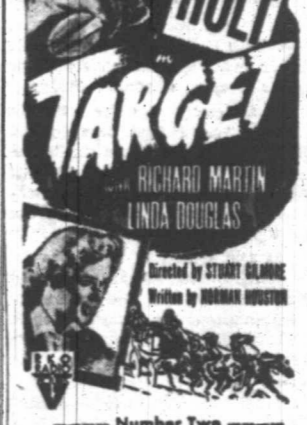
The fact is the modern English mother can't cook, Maj. A. P. Nicholson of the Army Catering Corps told competitors in an Army cooking contest here.

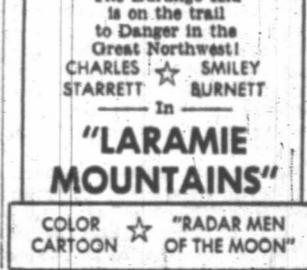

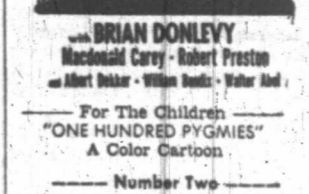
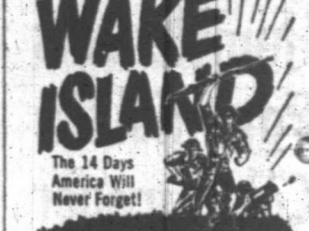

Cool Summer Menu Suggestions Can Keep You Range-Free

If you'd welcome a vacation from the torturing task of hot Summer cooking, make this quick-to-fix turkey salad stuffing.

It is the basis for three cool, nourishing main-course salads which are economical because you can use this filling to stuff any fruits or vegetables you happen to have in the refrigerator. It is made of boned turkey that comes in the can in which it was cooked.

Here is a full menu for a wholesome meal planned to give you good nutrition and freedom from the hot range:

Cream of pea soup, turkey salad stufettes, whole wheat rolls, butter,

chocolate ice cream pie and milk or iced tea.

For the turkey salad stufettes, use one 6-ounce can of boned turkey, diced; 3/4 cup cabbage, finely shredded, and 1/2 cup celery, finely diced.

Mix ingredients and use this turkey filling to stuff tomatoes, peach halves or fresh melon rings. Garnish with watercress and mayonnaise. The recipe makes four to six stufettes.

The cream of pea soup comes ready prepared in the can and your baker has whole wheat rolls available. Combine the meal with this chocolate ice cream pie that you "bake" in the refrigerator.

Chocolate Ice Cream Pie

For the crust use 20 chocolate wafers or 1 1/4 cups crumbs, 1/3 cup melted butter or margarine. Crush chocolate wafers. Add melted fat and mix well. Press into greased 9-inch pie pan. Chill in refrigerator until set.

For the filling use 1 pint vanilla ice cream, 1 pint chocolate ice cream and 1/4 cup chocolate syrup.

Allow the ice cream to soften in the refrigerator but not melt. Place vanilla ice cream in a bowl and stir to a creamy, frozen consistency. Spoon this around inside edge of the pie shell leaving a large hole in the center. Fill this center with chocolate ice cream mixed to a creamy but still frozen consistency. Quickly place the pie in the frozen food compartment of the refrigerator (or rake the pie in the ice tray and place in the ice compartment) until the ice cream melts. Pour a stream of chocolate syrup over the vanilla ice cream portion of the pie before serving.

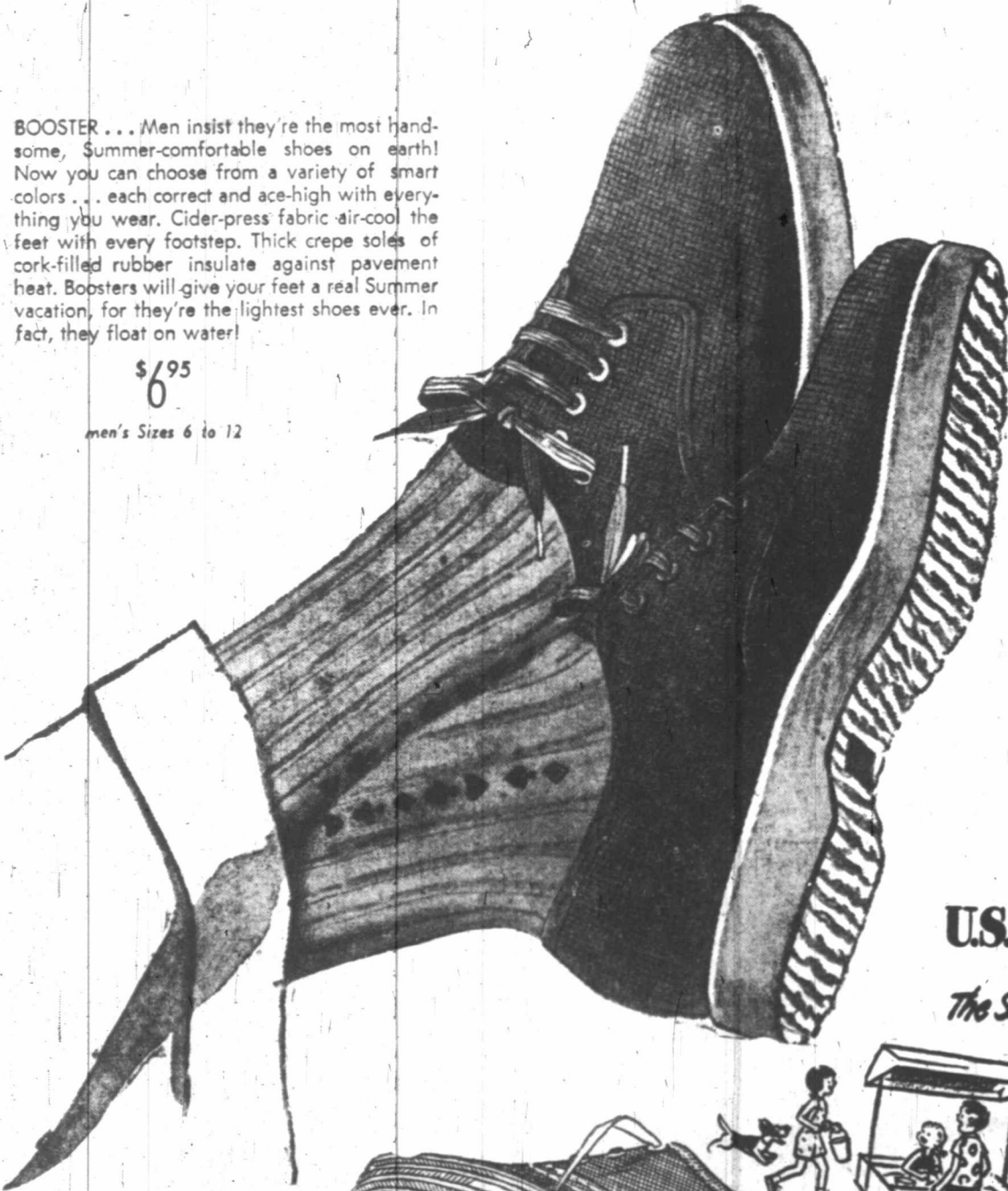

Signals In News Hint Everything Going Up In Value Except Wives

NEW YORK—(AP)—Ladies, there are storm signals in the news hinting that everything is rising in value today except wives.

Are wives over-inflated? Should they be put under controls? These issues have been raised by two recent items of interest to every thoughtful woman, and by that of course, I mean every woman:

1. A British judge, granting a divorce to a husband whose wife ran off with another man, cut the husband's claim for damages from \$700 to \$210, and said:

"Her value to her husband was diminishing from year to year because of disagreements."

2. Dr. Samuel W. Stevenson, a Virginia professor, describing women as "the arch foe," called for a new St. George to emancipate American men and give them four new freedoms, to wit:

"Freedom from nagging, freedom from backseat driving, freedom to relax in old clothes after a hard day's work, and freedom from indigestion."

Men Become 'Worms'
Observing with sad hilarity that men no longer deserved the title "nice" as women are afraid of mice, he said "we have become worms."

It is high time, the good professor added, that men force the restoration of the word "obey" in the marriage ceremony. He thinks men also ought to decide when they need a haircut, pick their own clothes and their wife's hats, and decide whether "the Joneses are to be kept up with or not."

But this was his most revolutionary idea:

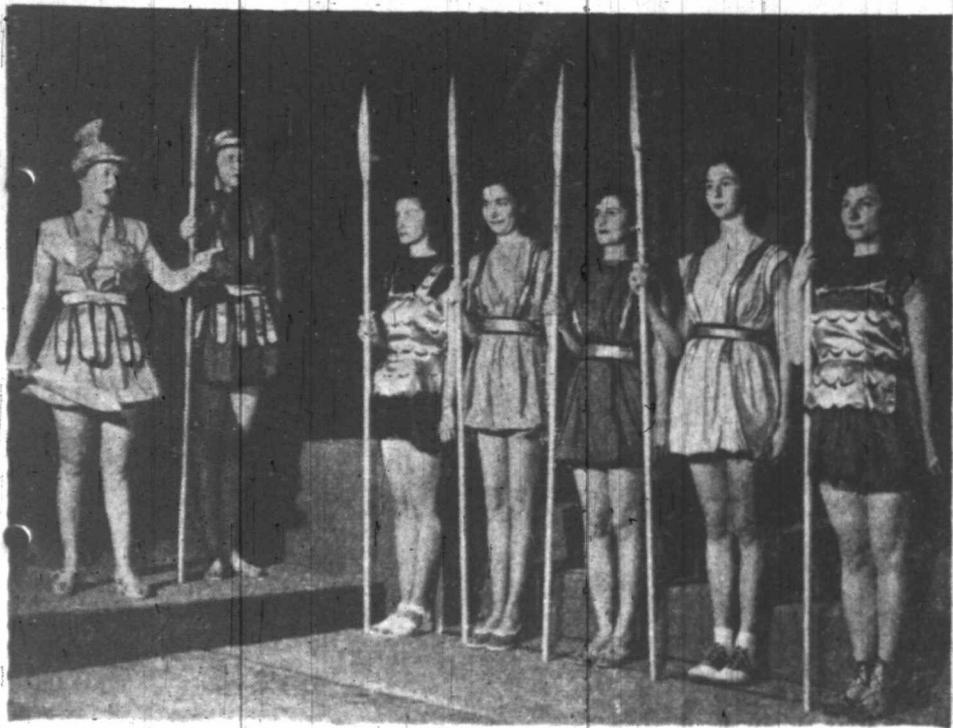
"No woman, married or single, shall be permitted to speak of her intuition until she had kept in writing for one year an accurate account of all her snap judgments and has compiled a record of at least 60 per cent accuracy."

The average wife would leap at this chance to show Dr. Stevenson up. Any woman instinctively knows enough about double entry book-keeping to prove her intuition is at least 99 per cent correct—not a lame 60 per cent.

Wives Get Thin?
Nor can we see many wives getting thin from worrying over the professor's bugle call for a male rebellion in America. If husbands have become worms in this country, it is through sheer laziness, the abandonment of masculine responsibility to the philosophy of "let the little woman 'do it.'" Such worms are unlikely to turn in revolt.

But that British judge's decision is an entirely different matter. It strikes at the very heart of women's theory of power:

Does any wife want it written in the lawbooks that her value decreases "from year to year because of disagreements"? It is an uneasy precedent.

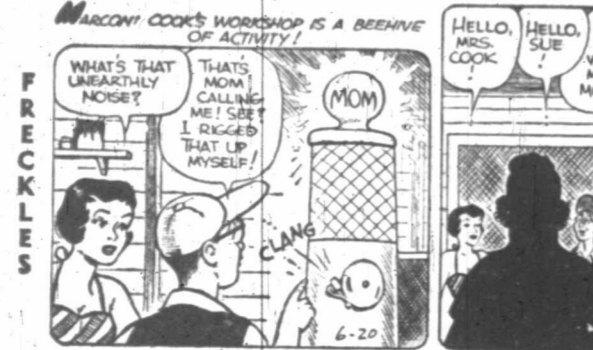

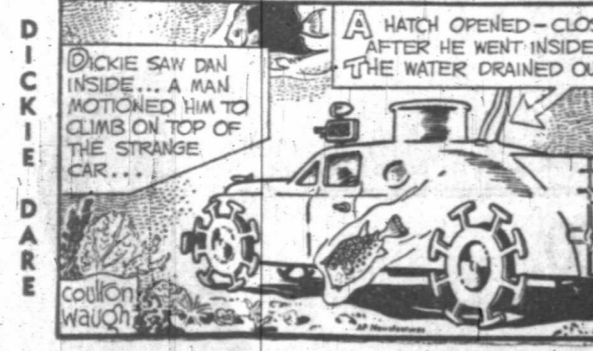
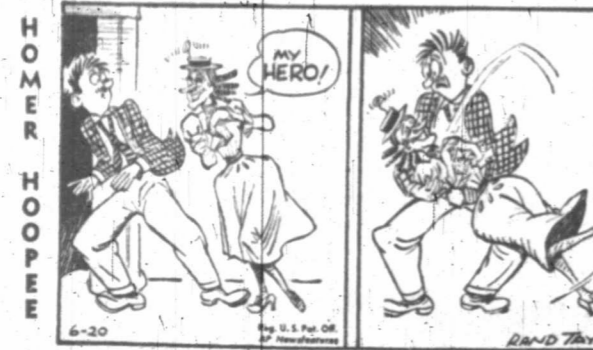

Utah's Delegates Like Harriman, Kerr

SALT LAKE CITY—Utah delegates to the Democratic National Convention reported Thursday they favor W. Averell Harriman and Senator Robert S. Kerr for the Democratic presidential nomination.

The Associated Press poll of 17 of the 20 delegates—who have 12 votes split up among them—showed seven delegates for Harriman, the mutual security director, and five for Oklahoma's Kerr. Five were undecided.

If the uninstructed delegates carry their preferences to Chicago Kerr will receive 11.2 votes from Utah. Harriman should get four. That's because four delegates have one vote each and the other 16 have one-half apiece. Three delegates not contacted had a full vote each.

State Chairman Milton Wellenmann was the only full-vote delegate to express a preference—he was for Harriman.

Restrictions Lifted On '53 Wheat Crop

WASHINGTON—Secretary Agriculture Brannan announced Thursday that because of the tense international situation farmers will escape federal production and marketing restrictions on the 1953 wheat crop.

He said in a statement that due to this year's indicated near-record crop, prospective supplies have reached the "surplus" level of crop control laws. Normally he would have to proclaim rigid controls to hold down next year's production.

JET ENGINES TO SUBMARINES—

Breakdown In Arms Output Seen If Steel Strike Lasts

WASHINGTON (AP)—Industry and the military say the nation's arms production—everything from jet engines to atom bombs and nuclear submarines—will come to a virtual halt within a few weeks if the steel strike continues.

The Defense Department has requested contractors to shift steel orders to non-steel plants. There aren't many of these.

A spokesman for the Air Materiel Command said Thursday night the strike has not greatly affected military aircraft production to date.

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—Some 4,000 hungry Pennsylvania Republicans sat down to \$100-a-plate dinners in Philadelphia and Harrisburg Thursday night and lustily vowed to support anyone who emerges from the GOP National Convention as the party's presidential candidate.

Upwards of 2,500 party campaign contributors shed dinner coats in the oppressive heat of Philadelphia's Convention Hall and loudly hurraed demands for "bold national leadership" made by keynote speakers from both sides of the Taft-Eisenhower political fence.

Senator Everett M. Dirksen (R-Ill.), the man selected to deliver the nomination speech for Sen. Robert A. Taft at the Chicago convention next month, and Rep. Walter H. Judd (R-Minn.), an outspoken Eisenhower supporter, struck a chord of unity by assailing Democratic leadership and omitting mention of the men they support.
