





For some time we have been scraping along with a slim output of vital steel. Inevitably the national defense program will suffer. So will the entire domestic economy. of course. And that includes the steel workers them-

Every time a major strike occurs, some enterprising fellows always tot up the economic losses, in output, wages, profits and so on. The bill generally is staggering.

Maybe the time will come when we will regard these losses as too great to bear. In the complex state of our industrial organization, in the precarious state of our relations with the Communist world, time is of supreme value. The time that is thrown away when men strike never can be regained.

That time spells money in workers' pockets. It spells, in this instance, steel for guns and tanks and automobiles and ice boxes. We will make these things again at the scheduled rates envisioned by our business and military leaders. But we never shall make the ones we could be producing now.
