First Ballot Writes Win For General

CONVENTION HALL, CHICAGO -(AP)- Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower Friday won the Republican presidential

In a dramatic climax to a ding-dong fight with Senator Robert A. Taft of Ohio, Eisenhower crashed through to the GOP accolade on the first ballot.

On the rollcall, Eisenhower first received 595 votes to 502 for Taft. But before the vote could be announced, Minnesota threw to the general 19 votes it first had given o Harold E. Stassen.

While you are planning the lunch, consider individual pies, cupcakes, doughnuts and fruit cups. Wrap them and mark them plainly and each member of the family can make up his own lunch. Prozen inches are especially good in Sumner since they will not spoll while they are waiting to be eaten.

If there are babies in the family ou can prepare pureed fruits, vegetables and meats in very little time. Frèeze them in ice cube trays. When they are frozen, release the cubes, package them in portions adjusted to the child's appetite. Baby food from the freezer can be thawed

Store Fried Foods For the family that enjoys fried foods such as coequets potatoes, doughnuts and fritters, the homemaker can set aside a morning or afternon, prepare several of these foods, set up the deep fryers and get to work. This saves time and energy, waiting for fat or shortening to heat, frying, and then cleaning up after the task is done. These foods can all be stored in the freezer after they have cooled and been properly packaged.

There is no longer the necessity of eating turkey or any other food that is leftover two or three days in uccession. Leftovers can be packaged and stored in the freezer until the family works up an appetite for these foods again. Vegetable leftovers can be placed in a heatproof glass casserole and frozen in it. These caseroles can be placed in the oven and the food reheated without thawing if you've a mind to work this way.



A new, fully automatic washing machine has recently been announced by an eastern manufacturer. The washer incorporates an instant stop and start control water-saying small load operation and a lighted interior. Operating on the same principles as the company's earlier models, the new washer is top-loading, free-standing, with agitator action. Once started it will automatically wash double ringe. and spin-dry a load of clothes and then shut itself off.



This was the first time that practical electric ranges had been exhibited publicly. Like many young inventors, Hughes was desperately in need of capital to launch his business venture. The display booth at the convention was paid for with borrowed cash. The top-heavy stoves had to be braced against a; wall while he cooked and baked ap-



When excessive or dangerous amounts of electrical current drawn toward your home, the fuse "blows," and the current cannot go beyond it. Actually, the fuse consists of a small "bridge" for the current to cross. Too much current causes the "bridge" of soft metal to melt in two-and with no bridge to cross the excessive current cannot get in to damage your property.

Putting pennies or other metals which conduct electricity into the fuse boxes to substitute for the "bridge" invites tragedy. The penny won't melt when too much power strikes it. Saving the price
