
probably the number one problem in the world today. Due to the "space" given to terrorism in the mass media, this is no surprise to anyone. What people don't want to hear is the fact that the problem is likely to get worse before it gets better. This is because nations such as Libya operate terrorist training camps, backed by leader Muammar Kaddafi. Last month, a virtual "terrorists' convention" was held in Libya. Kaddafi was one of the meeting's principal speakers. The terrorists are an outgrowth of the battles within the Mideastern countries, which have been raging since the time of Christ and before. The Palestinians' fight for a homeland is one reason the terrorists operate. Most of the terrorists are anti-Israeli in their makeup. The United States is a friend of Israel, so the terrorists turn on American citizens whenever possible. The latest episode, in which the U.S. Sixth Fleet fired missiles at Libyan targets in the Gulf of Sidra, sinking at least two Libyan boats in the process, has only heightened the activity. Since the Gulf of Sidra incident, we have witnessed the bomb planted in the TWA plane which resulted in American deaths, and this past weekend the bombing of the night club in West Germany, in which an American serviceman was killed.

While most observers felt that the United States was right in its Gulf of Sidra maneuver, and that Kaddafi needed to be "taught a lesson," it doesn't necessarily work that easily. Kaddafi and his group of terrorists practically invented the "eye for an eye" theory, and retaliation is their byword. Terrorists like to prey on the helpless, and this makes fighting them virtually impossible. For example, the hijacking of the pleasure ship, Achille Lauro, on which mostly retired, elderly people were vacationing. Another example was at the Rome airport recently, where terrorists gunned down an 11-yearold American girl. Last September, terrorists boasted of attacking a swimming pool in Athens, used by American military people. The truth of the matter was that when the pool was grenaded, those using the pool were members of a tour group of the handicapped.

The terrorists are so steeped in religious zeal that they believe the acts they commit in behalf of their nation will result in greater rewards in the hereafter. This is also true of the Moslems in Iran, which held the American captives for over a year.

Therefore, the young terrorists are not afraid to die while in "combat," since this theoretically would enhance their after-life rewards. Most observers feel that the terrorist acts will not invade American soil, but it's bad enough that they single out Americans abroad. It is somewhat ironic that at a time when our own national economy needs a shot in the arm, that the terrorists may be doing our country a favor. No amount of editorials urging Americans to spend their travel dollars at home rather than abroad could ever succeed in this effort like the 5 p.m. terrorist incidents are likely to.

SCS Advises **Farmers On New Provisions**

The sodbuster and swampbuster provisions of the 1985 farm bill went into ffect on December 23, 1985, when the President signed the Food Security Act of 1985.

"That date is very significant for any producer who plows out highly erodible land or drains wetlands after the law was signed," said Bill Donham, district conservationist for the USDA Soil Conservation Service at Friona. "It could mean the producer would have to forfeit USDA program benefits in 1986 if the land is used to produce a crop in 1986.

"The Department has not had time to publish and implement rules and regulations since the g legislation was signed," Donham continued. "That is why we do not know the specific criteria that will be used to determine which lands




Baize Is 'Man Of The Year'


