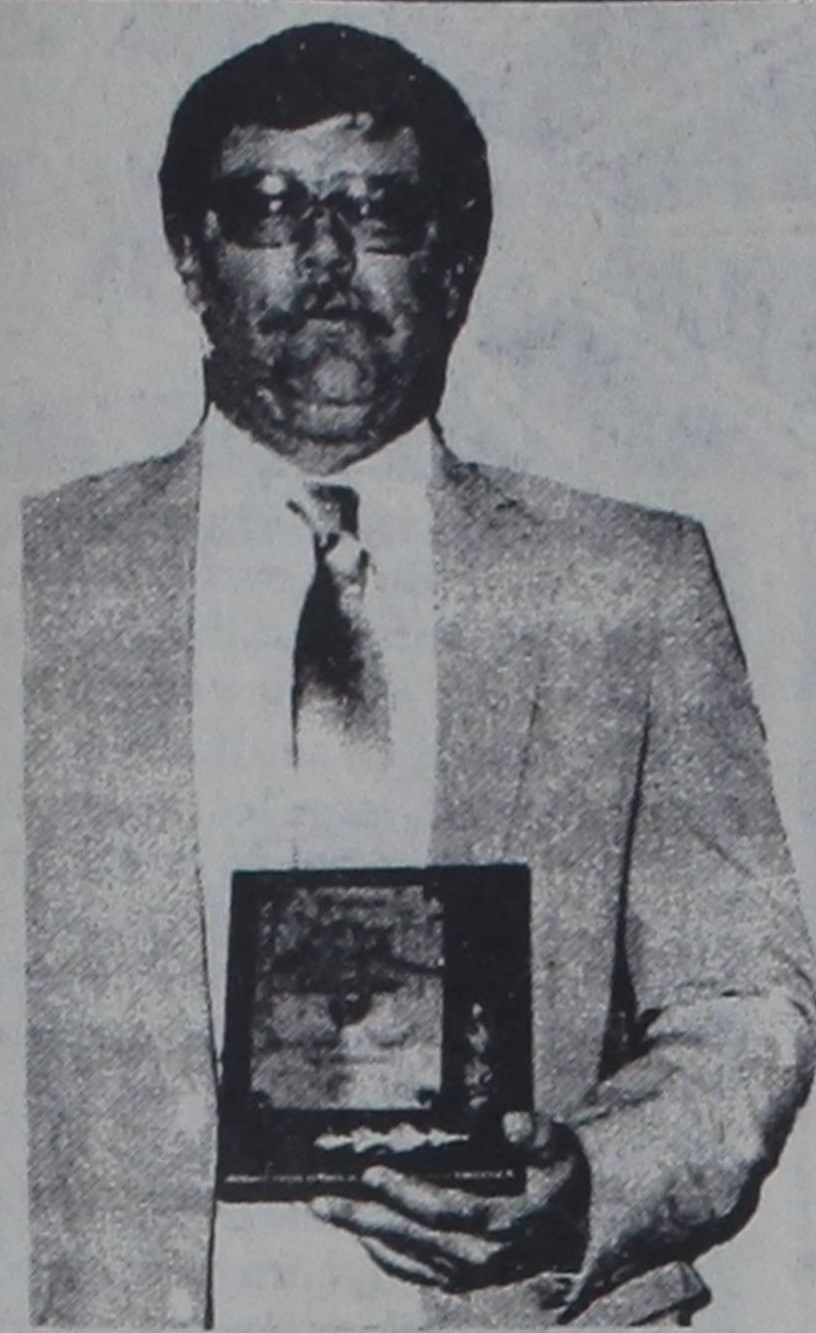

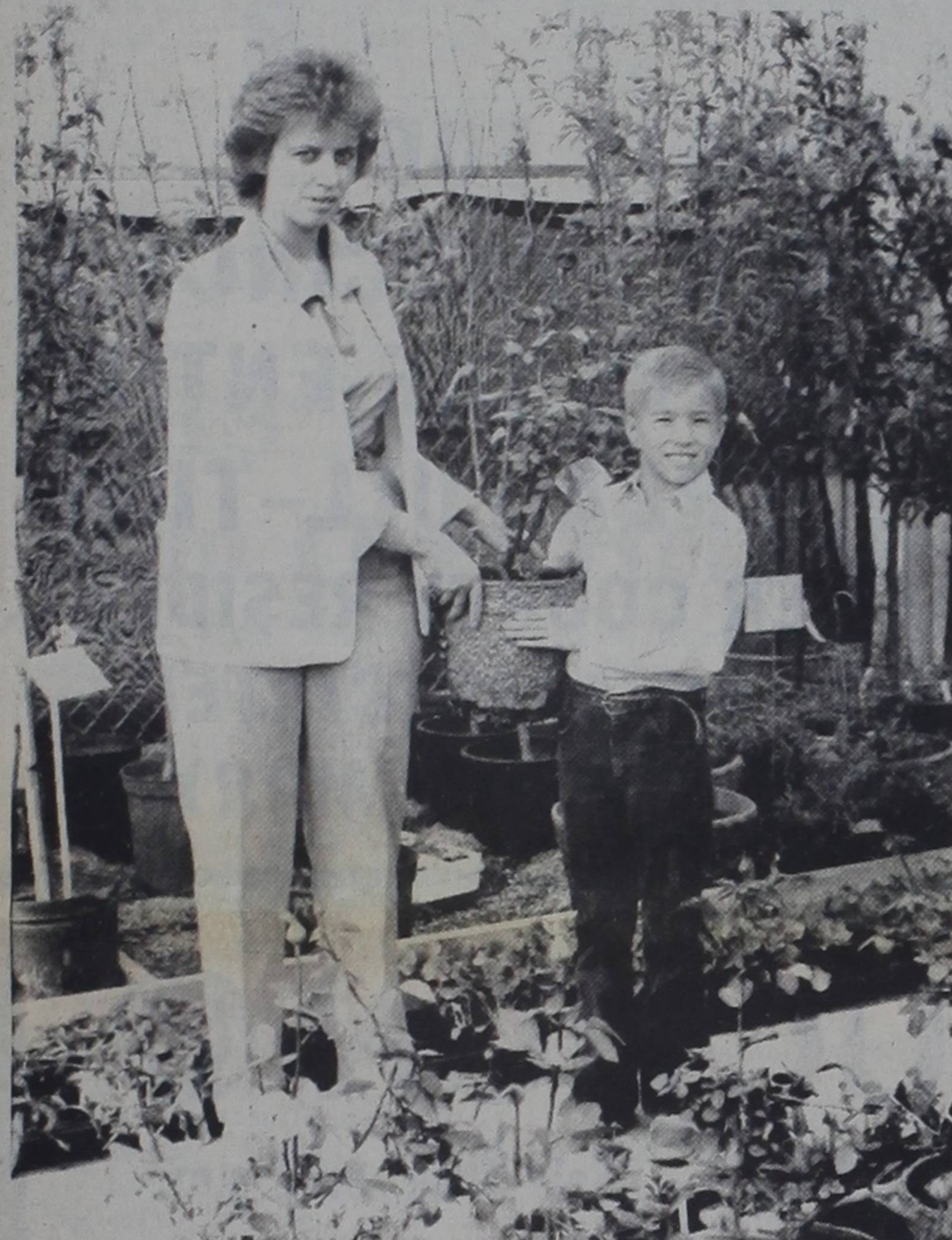
Tae Kwon Do Show Set

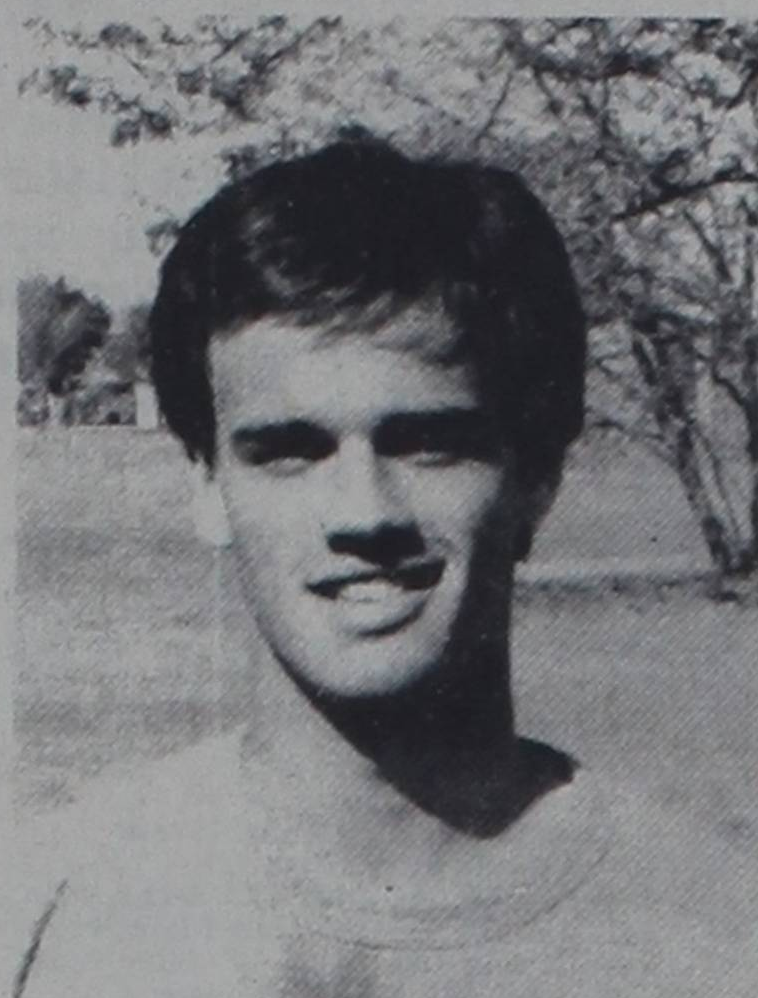
AT AMARILLO MEET

Britting Clears 14' To Pace Tracksters

Pole vaulter Rod Britting soared to new heights in the Amarillo Relays Track and Field meet last weekend, clearing 14 feet to amend the school record in the event for the second time in as many weeks.

Britting had been clearing the height fairly consistently in practice, but this was his first time over the 14-foot mark in meet competition.

The only drawback to the performance was the fact that the FHS vaulter happened to be in the same competition with Gene Brooks of River Road, who set an all-time area record by clearing 15-1, relegating Britting to second place for his outstanding effort.

Britting's mark is also the second-best in the Panhandle area this spring, for athletes of all school classifications.

Shy Burney, who likewise is listed on the boys' track honor roll, won his event, clearing 6-4 in the process. Burney also placed third in the long jump event with a 20-9 effort, his best of the spring.

Daniel Echols placed third in the 400-meter dash with a time of 51.7. Echols also is ranked in the area's "honor roll" with his best time of 51.2.

Daniel Padilla placed fourth in the discus event with a toss of 135-2. Jeff Chaney was fourth in the shot put competition with a toss of 41-6 and Danny Perez placed fourth in the 800-meter run at 2:14.

Sam Montoya placed fifth in the pole vault, clearing 12-6.

Jerry Lafuente placed fifth in the 1600-meter run with a time of 5:21. Lafuente also placed fifth in the 3200-meters (two miles), with a time of 11:27.

Lance Gatlin placed fifth in the 110-meter hurdles with a 16.21 effort and Peter Malouf placed sixth in the 300-meter intermediate hurdles.

Friona's relay teams qualified for the finals, but did not place. The Chieftains were leading after the first day's events with 35 points in the field events. They finished up with 52 points, good for sixth place in the meet.

The Friona Squaws are entering their final warmup meet this weekend at the Amarillo Girls Relays. Their district meet will be April 19 at Idalou.

"I think everyone is ready to find out how we stack up against the district teams. We have run against some pretty tough competition, and I believe the girls are ready to give it a whirl in district," says Squaw coach Vicki Hatton.

Speaking of tough competition, the Squaws had plenty of that last Saturday at Pampa, where some of the Panhandle's top athletes of all classes competed.

Friona managed just one first place, by Lacye Osborn in the 800-meter run. Lacye had to turn in her best time of the season for the win, 2:23.

The Squaws' 1600-meter relay team (Ronda Ratcliff, Susan Bailey, Mika Maddox and Lacye Osborn), ran a 4:12.2, but had to settle for fifth place in the star-studded field at Pampa. The same foursome, competing in the 800-meter relay, ran a 1:50.4, which is good enough to win most meets, but likewise placed fifth.

Miss Ratcliff cleared 4-10 in the high jump, another fifth place finish.

In the Amarillo meet, the Squaws will be a large school in the three division (A-AA-AAA) bracket, and Coach Hatton is expecting somewhat better placings.

"We're hoping the weather warms up for the meet, and for the district meet as well," she concluded.

"I felt we played real well, especially the boys," said FHS tennis coach Lynn Weiland, who is getting his teams geared up for their district matches this coming week.

Boys, Girls State Delegates Named

The American Legion and Auxiliary Post 206 sponsors students from Friona High School to attend the Boys State and Girls State programs each year.

Farwell High School also sends a boy and girl to participate in this program sponsored through the local Post and Units.

This program is designed to teach these delegates the complete workings of our state government by actually organizing the "51st Mythical State"—Boys State for the boys and Bluebonnet Girls State for the girls.

The session for the boys is held on the University of Texas campus for seven days and Girls State is held at Texas Lutheran College, Seguin, and lasts ten days. The 51st State is organized from the city, to the county to the state levels.

The delegates are separated into cities, counties and political parties before they arrive. They are given orientation on government practices and organizations and then they organize their own city government, choosing the form of government they would like to work with, and are taught to campaign for the different offices and what it takes to make our government work.

The state offices—governor, lieutenant governor, attorney general, secretary of agriculture, railroad commissioner, judges and all other offices become a reality to each boy and girl attending these

sessions when they get the candidates elected and go to the capitol of Texas to be installed into the very offices that our present political officers work in.

They have the opportunity of listening to some of the outstanding speakers of our state and get to know them on a one on one basis.

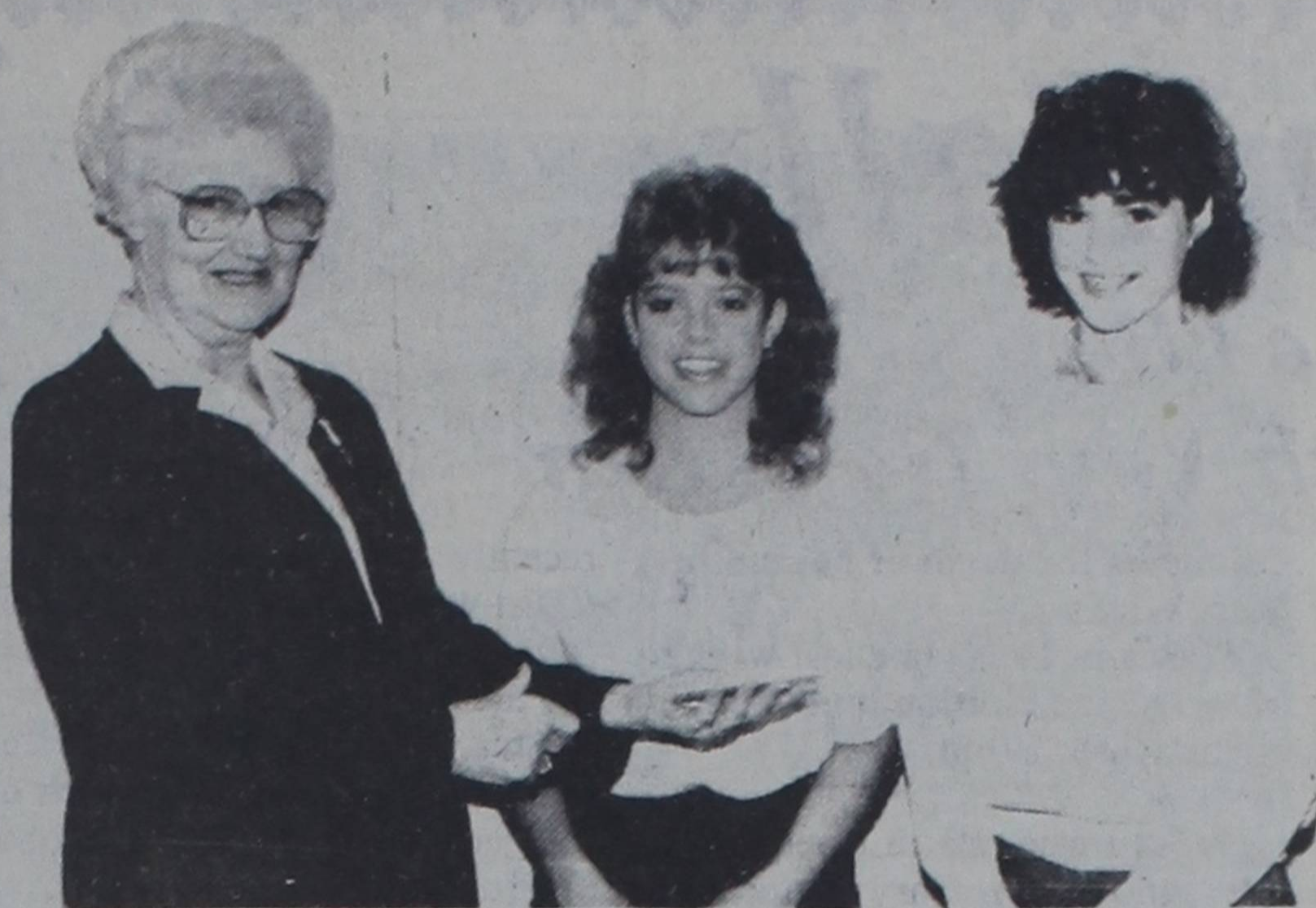
"We feel that these programs teach our students more in these short periods of time than they can get from their studies in school," says Geneva Williams, Unit Girls State Chairman.

Another experience for some of these delegates is the chance to board and fly for the first time. These students are closely supervised at all times and should any need arise, the delegates are cared for.

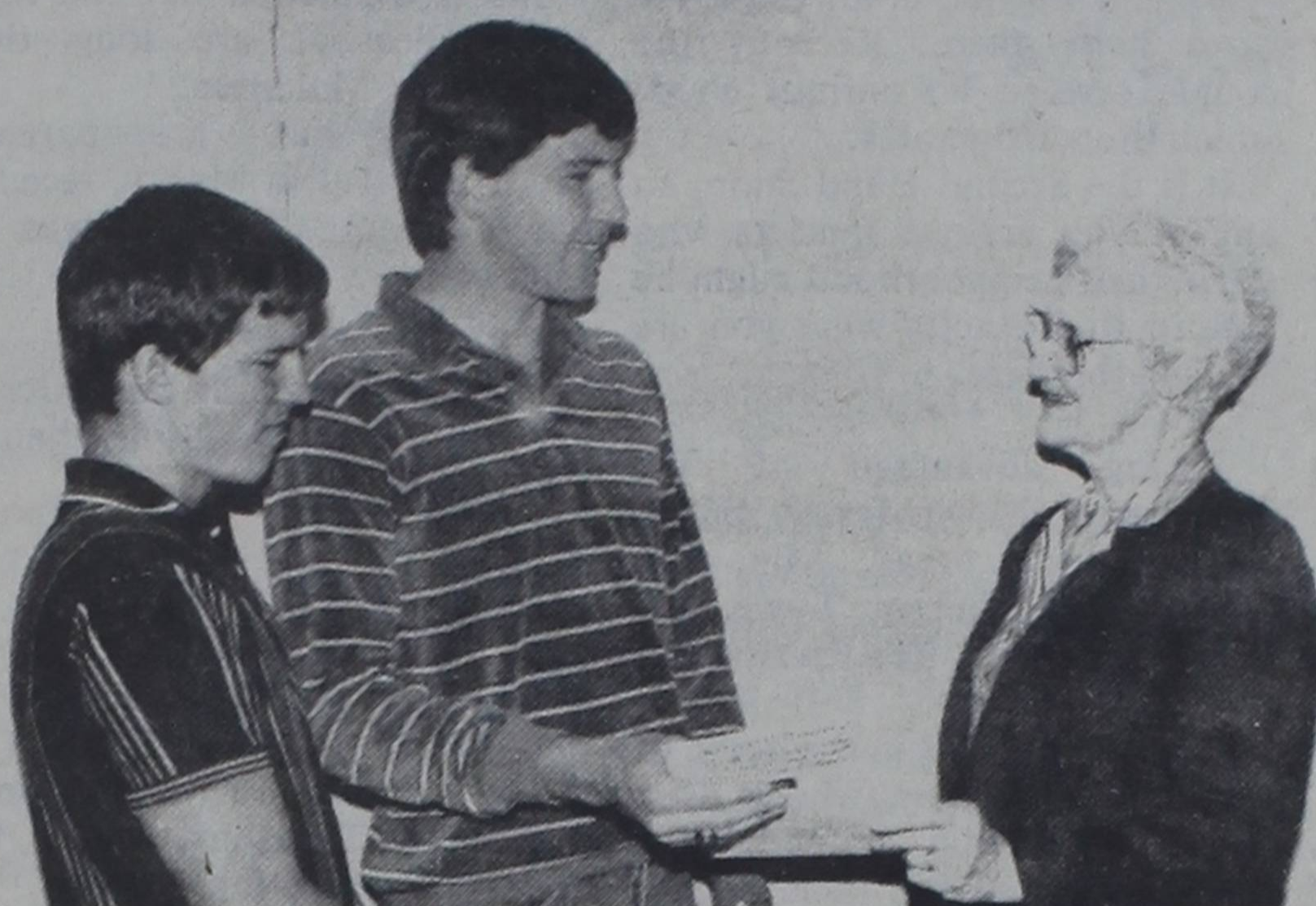

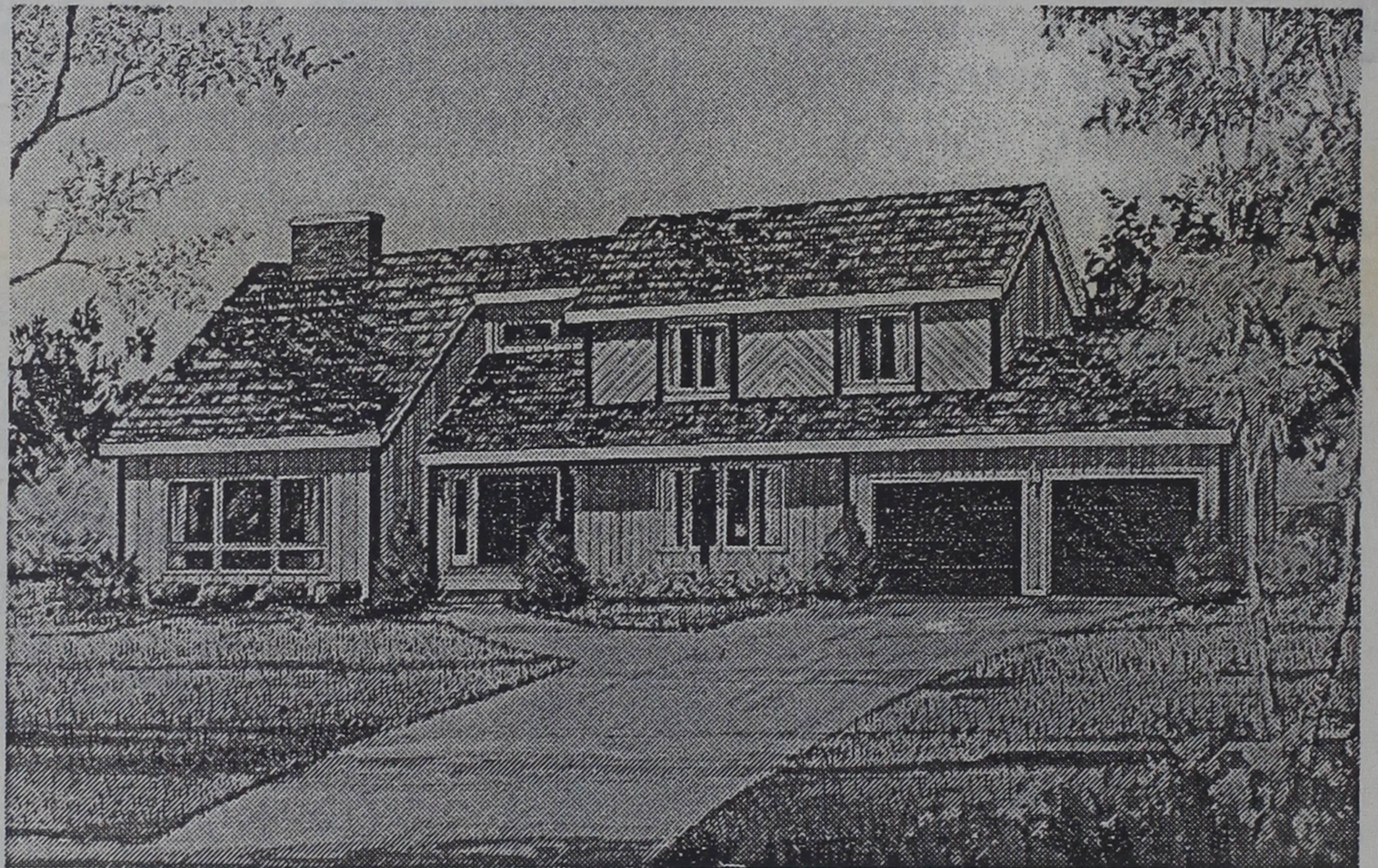
