the likelihood of having Texas zoned Vernon for waterfowl. The Texas Game Commission has recommended that the Wildlife zone Texas for waterfowl

and if zoning is not allowed, that state-wide season open October 31. Dodgen said a longer season would the result of increasing influence which the Council of Flyways has been conceded by the Wildlife Service. The council petitioned Washington officials to assign a federal coordinator to each flyway to work with the state game administrators and technicians.

Dodgen said this new approach to regulatory problems would provide greater sensitivity to the needs of the waterfowl, to problems of agricultural interests along the flyways and in the Winter feeding areas and to the rights of the hunter.

#### Records Show Virginia Dems Signed State 'Loyalty Pledge'

By PETER EDSON

WASHINGTON - Extensive digging into Virginia political records, since the great battle of the Chicago Democratic convention over the seating of the Virginiadelegation, has turned up a number of surprise gimmick

If all the facts now known had been full understood at Chicago, there is some question as to whether the result would have been what it

The big issue at stake was of course Virginia's refusal as Democrata. to sign the loyalty pledge, promis-ing to support all future actions of the Chicago convention majority,

whatever they might be.
In his dramatic speech before the Chicago convention, Gov. John S. Battle of Virginia declared over the roar of the crowd, "We believe in the freedom exemplified by Thomas Jefferson in whose county I happen to live. We are not going to sign any pledge that will jeopardise that freedom." And Virginia delegates

were excused from signing. What the Chicago convention did not know, however, was that every Democratic candidate for a public job in Virginia was required to sign a pledge of loyalty before he could run for that office in the state primary. This is the state Democrats' "Pledge of Honor:"

"I, ... , do state on my sacred honor that I am a member of the Democratic Party and believe in its principles; that I voted for all the nominees of said party at the preceding general election in which I voted and in onminees had opposition; and that I shall support and vote for all of the nominees of said party in the next ensuing general election."

The \$64 question which this Pledge monds and discarded the last heart of Honor raises is why a similar pledge of lovalty should not have been required of the Virginia delegates to the Chicago convention, if it was all right to exact such an oath of Virginia candidates for state offices?




