

Texas GOP Leaders Talk Politics With **General In Denver** 

DALLAS (P)-Two Texas Repul lican leaders were in Denver, Colo., Monday to talk politics with Gen.

Jack Porter of Houston, GOP National Committeeman, told reporters here he and other Southern Republican leaders would con-fer with the GOP Presidential nomnee over efforts to win the South in the Nevember election.

Ben Guill of Pampa, former Congressman and manager of the state GOP campaign, was to join Porter in Amarillo for the Denver flight, "I told the general July 31 that the outlook was excellent in Texas and I will tell him that again," Porter said.

Porter said he would urge Eisenhower to come to Texas but he would "have to think about it" before urging acceptance of an invitation to speak October 7 or 9 at the State Fair of Texas.

"I don't want him that early," Porter said. "I think it would be better politics to have him later, but we will take him when we can get him. The campaign would be at a higher pitch later in October." Porter said he was trying to get Eisenhower to Texas for at least two days but would prefer a threeday visit.

If Eisenhower comes, Porter said, he definitely would visit Houston, San Antonio and Dallas and "prob ably" Fort Worth, Amarillo, and

### Let's 'Get-Out-The-Vote'

An outfit called The American Heritage Foundation comes along with an old idea which looks good and some new figures which look bad.

The old idea is that people lucky enough to live in a country where they can vote should do it.

The new figures-new to us, at least-are comparisons of the number of people who vote here and in other countries, and the figures make us look pretty bad.

In 1948, for instance, only 51 per cent of the people in this country eligible to vote did so. But in 1948 in Italy 89 per cent of the eligibles voted.

In England last year the figure was 83 per cent. The year before in Belgium it was 90 per cent. In Canada, 75 per cent of the eligibles voted in 1949. In Sweden last year it was 80 per cent.

Furthermore, our voting record has been getting worse for about the last three-quarters of a century. In 1880, for instance, 78.4 per cent of the eligibles in this country voted. It had dropped to 73.5 per cent in 1900. When women voted for the first time in 1920 it dropped to what must have been an all-time low of 49.3 per cent.

Of the approximately 95,000,000 persons eligible to vote in the United States in 1948, only 48,680,416 actually went to the polls.

What accounts for this poor performance? The foundation lists what it believes are the reasons. For one thing, too many people think their "one little old vote" can't make any difference one way or the other.

Some are hopeless, because they think things are so bad, and others are indifferent, because they feel things Hoover, then secretary of commerce North and West Africa. Socony, are going well enough.
