Modernized Asian Forces

The major military development of the war in Korea, according to no less of an authority than commanding Gen. James A. Van Fleet of the 8th Army, has been the emergence of Asiatic armies as hard-hitting, professional fighting forces.

At the outbreak of the war and previously, the outstanding characteristic of an Asiatic army was its almost total reliance on manpower. Battles were won mainly by force of numbers, with the oriental commander often willing to spend 10 lives to kill one United Nations soldier.

But the Korean conflict has brought a striking changeover to more modern tactics based on cunning and improved use of firepower. The American-trained South Korean army now is considered a first-rate fighting force, far superior to the South Korean army that so often proved unreliable in the early stages of the war. And the Chinese and North Korean enemy is only slightly less proficient.

The Communists have learned much by observing and successfully imitating Western war methods. Van Fleet reveals that the Chinese in particular have shown an amazing ability to copy captured weapons, no matter how complicated. New Wonder Drugs Help Animals, Too

The wonder drugs have proven equally wondrous on canines and humans-and, in some ways, they're even more effective on dogs than

They make dogs grow faster. They lustrous. They make them healthier. They help cure some dog diseases that were formerly fatal, and work cures faster on others that used a drag out.

The use of the drugs in treating dog disease-like the secondary diseases stemming from distempe was to be expected. After all, the same general type of bug causes pneumonia in men and mongrels.

But the stimulating of dog growth -and the growth of other animalsby adding an antibiotic to the diet was surprising. And it still is surprising, because nobody really knows how or why it happens. But it does happen, and farmers and dog fanciers are very happy about the whole

Science first discovered that a dash of an antibiotic, such as terramycin, penicillin, streptomycin or sureomycin, was just the thing for a pung ptg. Farmers this year are saving vast sums of money because of this discovery. Adding aureomycin to the diet brings a pig to marketable maturity days before it could be done formerly; the farmers are saving the cost of those added days Runts Gain Weight

Dog fanciers, like John J. Dugan, a New Haven Conn., pharmacist, figured that the same thing might happen to dogs. He experimented. and it does. He used a feed with added streptomyein and sold it to his year, the reports came in and were

why this happens. One is that there are parasites in the intestines, and these unwelcome beasts prevent dogs from getting the full benefit out of food. Antibiotics, this theory has it. suppress these parasites, enabling the dog to use every last vitamin and mineral in his dog biscuit.

Another theory, more widely held. is that Vitamin B-12, which is asociated with antibiotics, does the

Distemper was long considered the second biggest cause of dog deaths. It has ben found to be like the com-mon cold in humans; it doesn't kill people itself, but it can lead to a fatal secondary infection. Antibiotics are ineffective against distemper, but nowadays that's not too important.

When a dog is brought into a veterinarian these days, the vet has a weapon. In all cases of this so-called "distemper complex"—an undiag-nosed infection resulting from distemper, or possibly two or more such infections—the vet shoots the animal with aureomycin.

He chooses aureomycin because it is a "broad-spectrum" antibiotic; it is effective against many diseases, not just one. So no matter what the disease that's troubling the dog, aureomycin can generally knock it

The same drug also is used during dog surgery, making that branch of veterinary practice much safer. Antibiotic ointments can control infections of the skin, eyes and ears. Research is going on to determine the effectiveness of antibiotics on varous types of worms.
