



Figure-Fibbers In Moscow

There's a "mess" in Moscow, too!

A report of Soviet difficulties comes from Prof. Albert Parry of Colgate University, who reads many Russian publications regularly. Parry relates that the Moscow press has been getting pretty cross lately at official bigwigs who turn in false reports.

It seems that the comrades who head bureaus and factories have been finding it tough to keep pace with the latest five-year production plan. And to save face, as well as their necks, they've been padding the figures.

One expose, fittingly dubbed the "Mirage of the Steppe," recently spotlighted the official of a large district who had been turning in reports of vast dams and irrigation works. These projects looked fine on the plan's official tally sheets until someone finally checked up and found that they'd never been built.

Another case of figure-fibbing was turned up in the city of Gorky. There, officials charged with opening new retail stores stuck up a number of flimsy shacks and counted them in their reports as newly established stores. "Soon enough," reports the newspaper which broke open the scandal, "the shacks fall apart, but still remain in the data as freshly opened trading centers."

As dozens of similar mirages have been turned up in agriculture and industry, the Kremlin has indicated that it's getting pretty fed up with them. If past performances mean anything, it is probable that future culprits will be in grave danger of losing their heads.
