Tom Johnson Is New JH Principal

Superintendent of Schools, Tom Jarboe, announced this week the placement of Thomas D. Johnson of Maple, Texas, as the new Junior High Principal, replacing Cecil Maddox at the end of the current school term. Maddox tendered his resignation to the school board last week.

Johnson served as Friona's boys basketball coach from 1980 to 1983. His last year in Friona, Johnson coached both the high school boys and girls basketball teams. He taught high school government and physical education.

From 1983 until the present time he has been the principal of Three Way ISD, grades K through 12, at Maple, in southern Bailey County.

The 36-year-old Johnson is a family man with two children, Andria, age eight, and Ben, age four, and his wife Peggy. He is a native of Indiana, having graduated from High School in Lowell, Indiana in 1969. He received his BA from Wayland Baptist University in 1974, his teaching certification from WTSU in 1975, and his MEd. degree from Texas Tech in 1986.

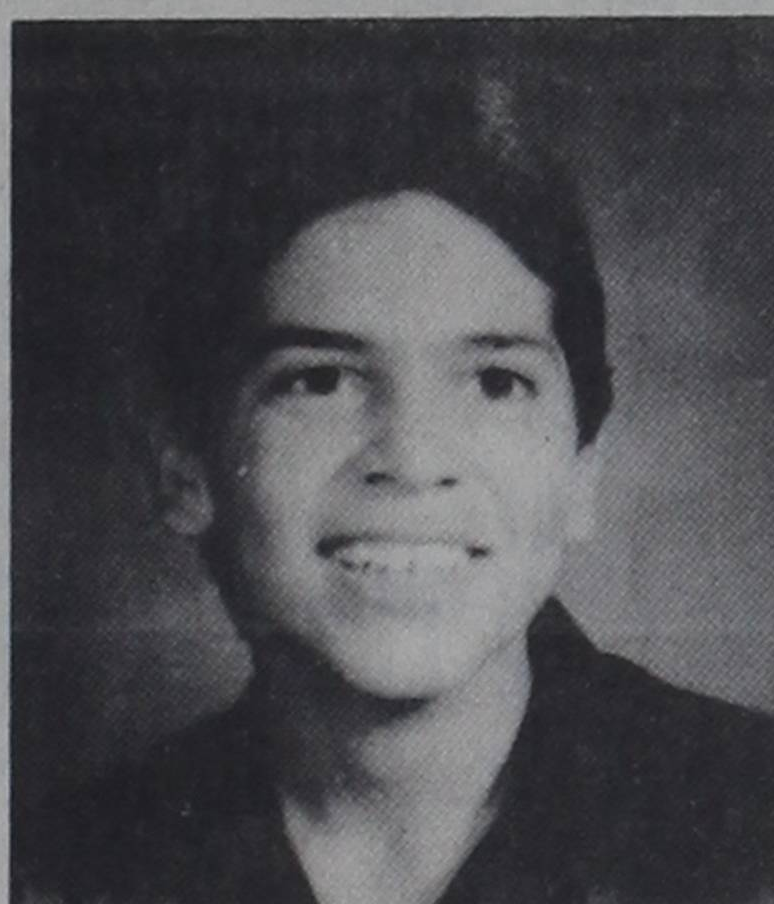
He played on the varsity basketball team at Wayland and began his coaching career at Kress. His classroom experience has been in government and history.

"We are pleased that Johnson has chosen to return to our community as the principal of Friona Junior High," Jarboe said.

Cecil Maddox, Friona Junior High Principal who has resigned effective the end of the current school term, will be honored with a reception Monday, May 26 at the Junior High.

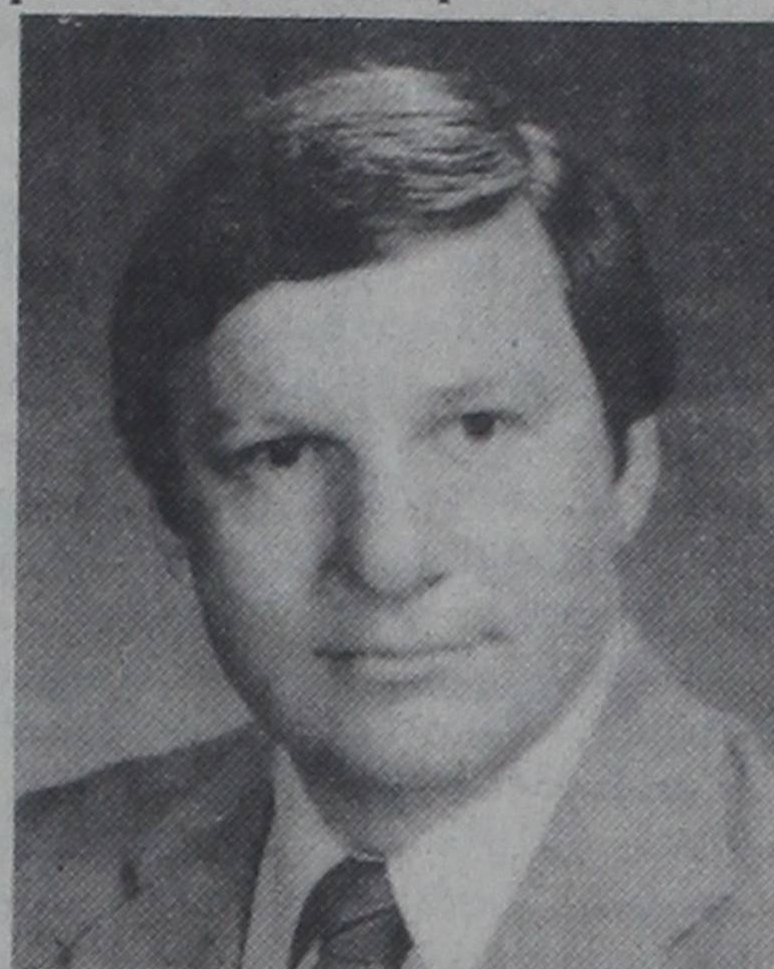
The reception will be 8:30-3:30 at the Junior High Homemaking Room.

The Friona area finally received some moisture last Saturday when a late-spring cold front dropped temperatures into the 30s for the entire day.

Official measurement in the city of Friona was .50 inches. It's the first appreciable moisture since the winter snows.

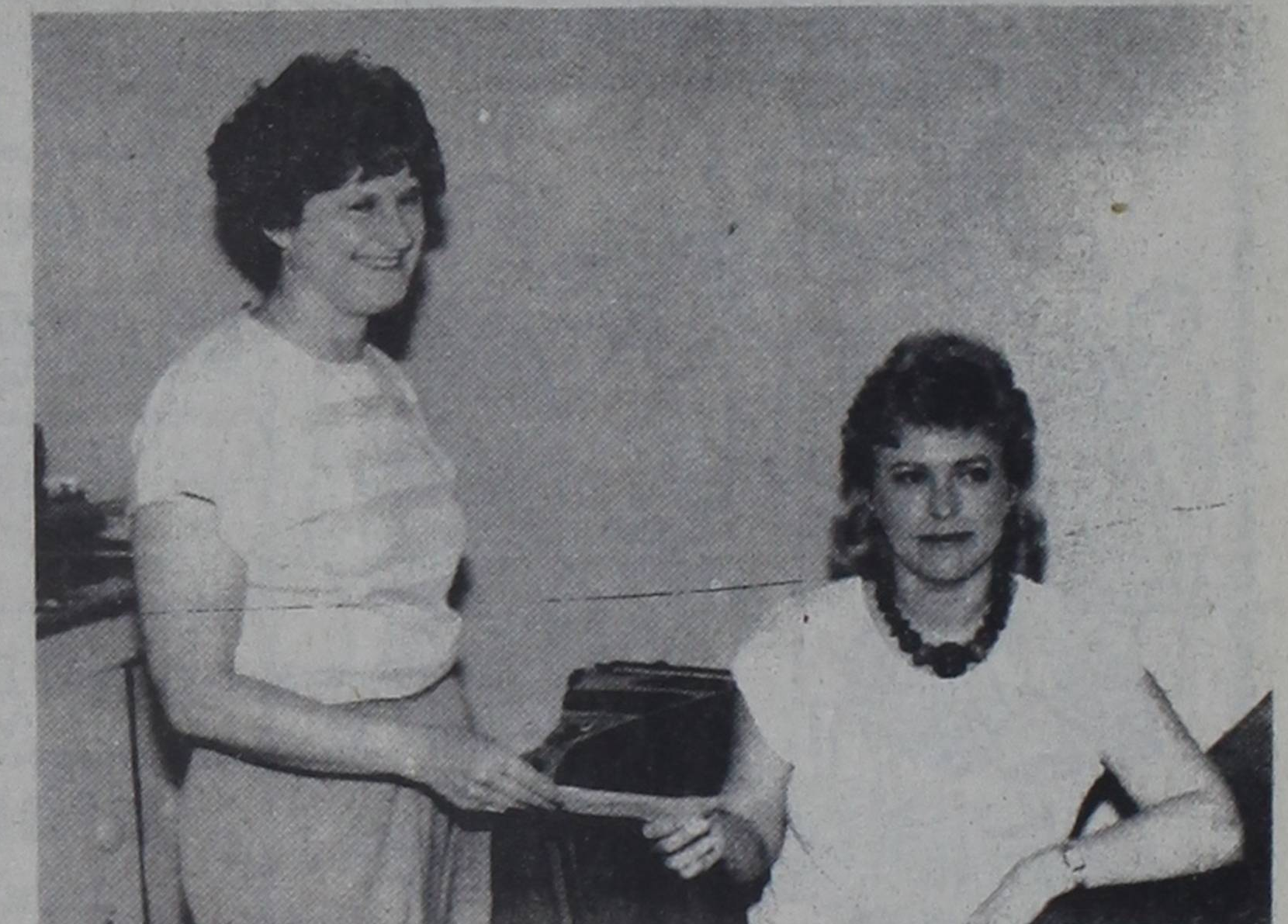
Early in the day the moisture began with large, sleet-like particles falling for awhile. This tapered off into a very light rain, which continued much of the day.

In the outlying area, especially into New Mexico, snow flurries were reported during the day, as the temperature hovered around 39 degrees. A brisk north wind throughout the day kept the chill factor in the low teens.

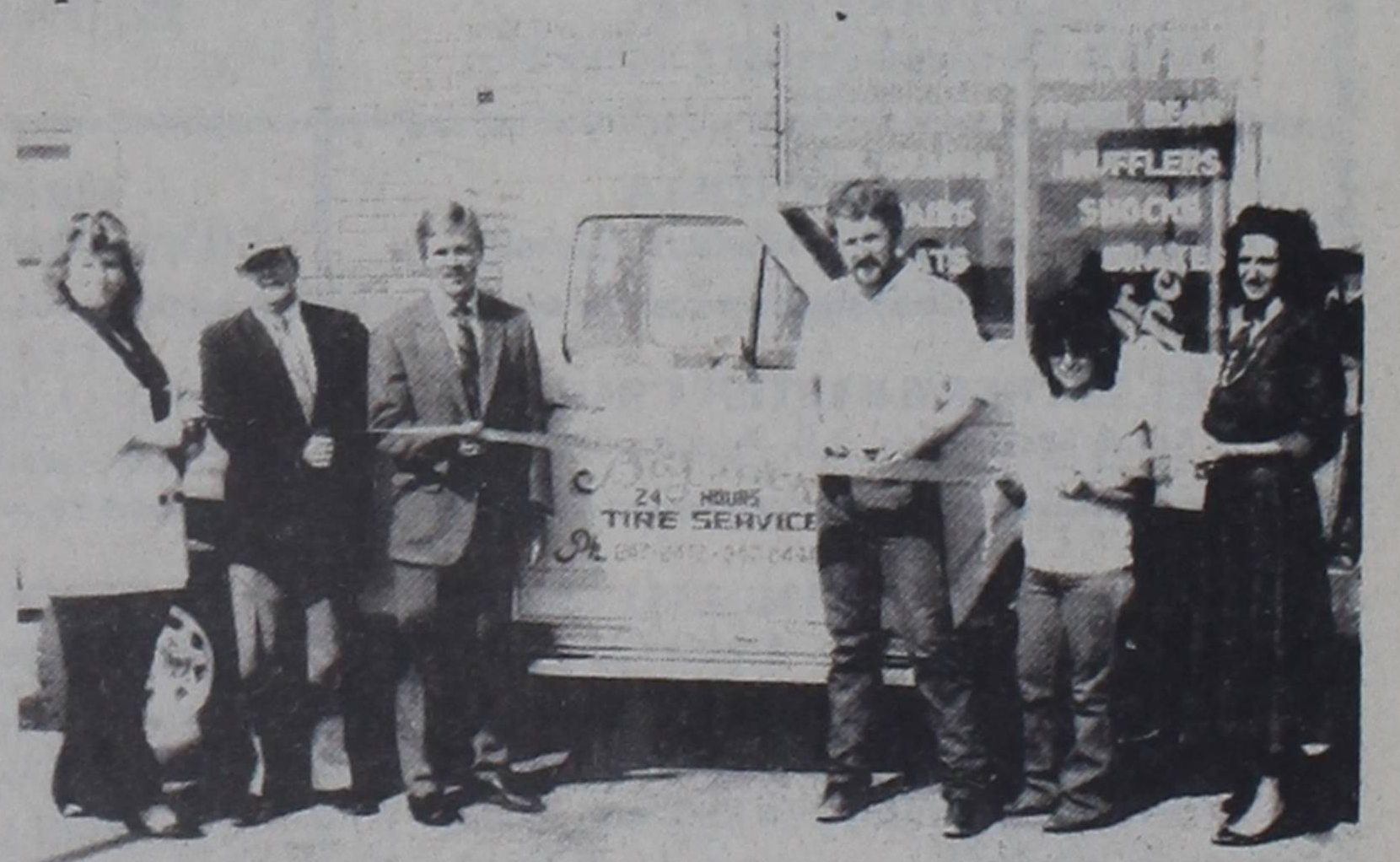
Saturday's temperatures were a stark contrast from the days immediately preceding, and following, as the temperature was back up to 95 degrees on Wednesday of this week.

Picnic Highlights Final Club Meeting

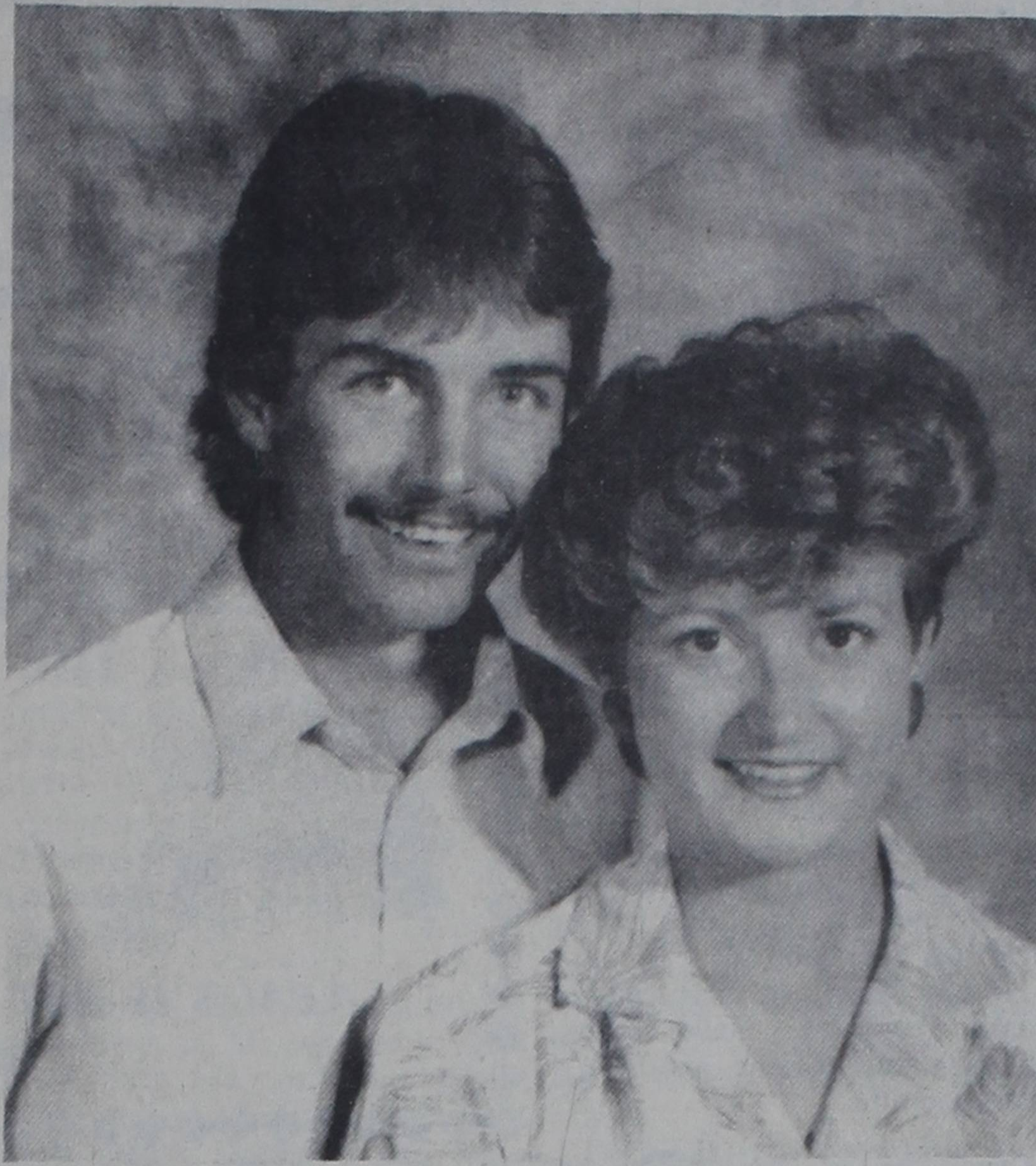
The Modern Study Club enjoyed an outdoor picnic for their final meeting of the year, Tuesday, May 20, at 7 p.m. at the Federated Club House.

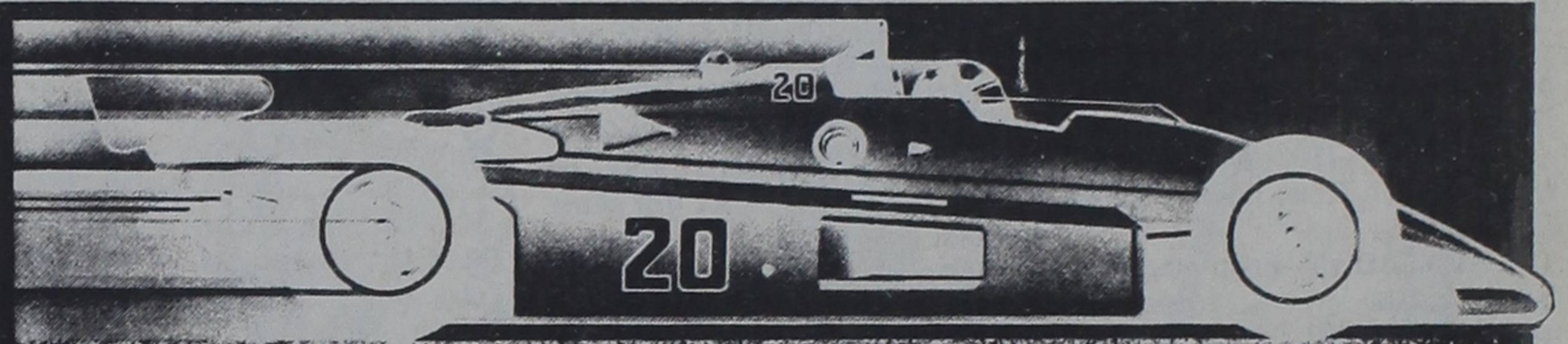

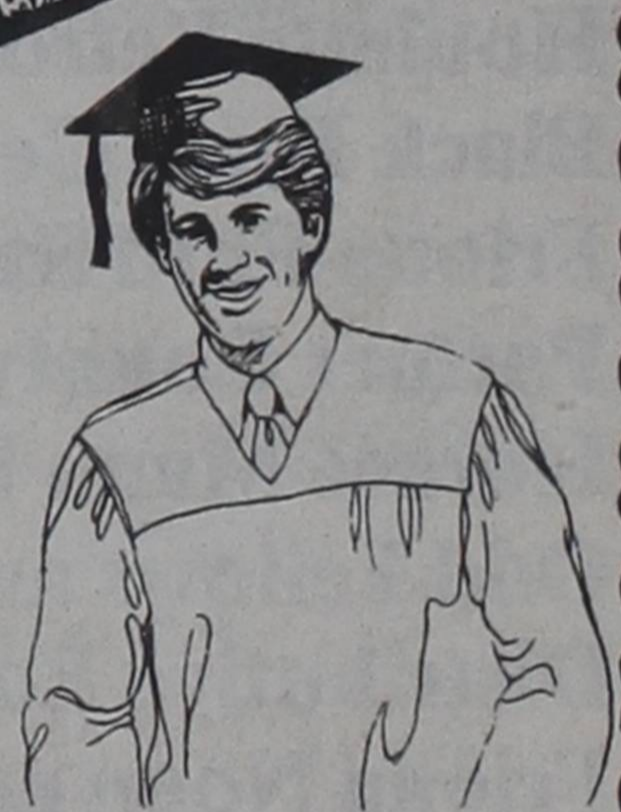

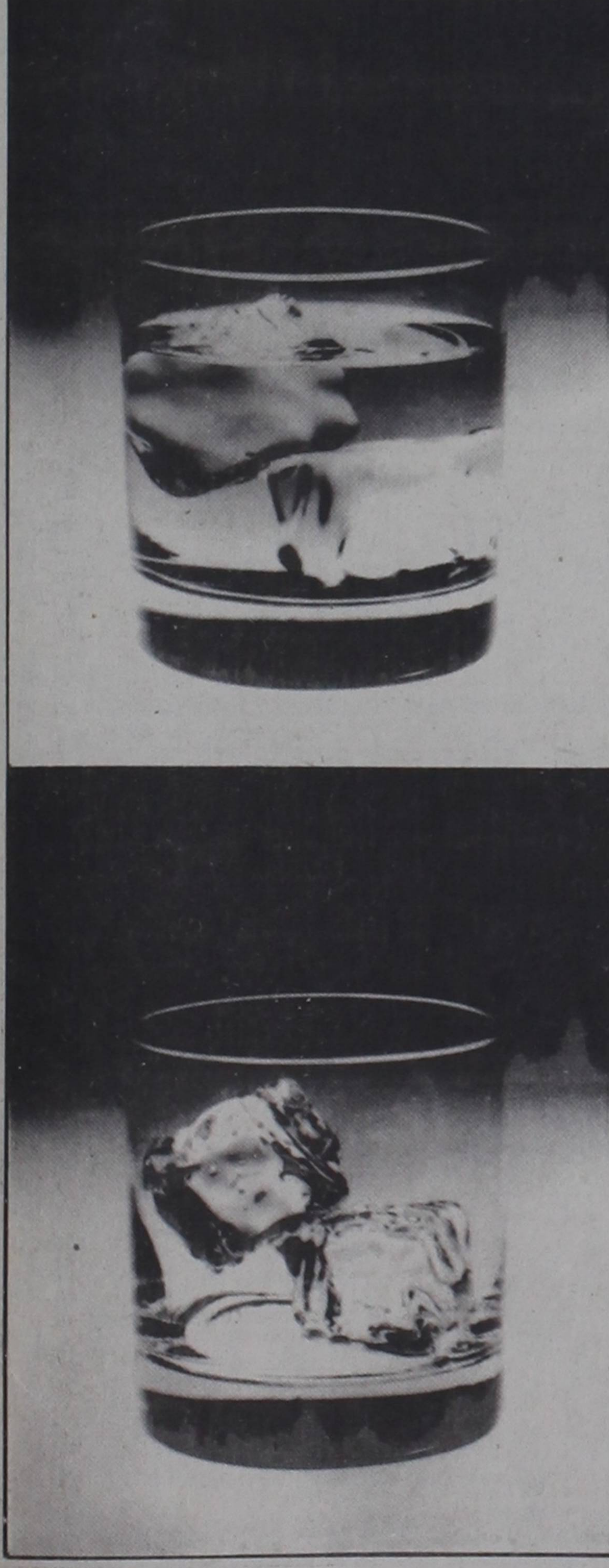

Holland Miss Has Enjoyed Her Stay

Tumbleweeds instead of tulips, cowboy boots instead of wooden shoes, oil derricks instead of windmills—these are just a few of the differences that our foreign exchange student, Sandra Wijnen, has encountered during her stay in Texas.

She has learned many new things and met many interesting people during her nine months in Friona. While she has been pouring herself into her activities in order to learn, Sandra has been teaching us at the same time. She's opened new windows to the world for many of us who have never thought much about the people and lands outside of Friona. For this, Sandra is truly our "dutch treat," and we're going to miss her a great deal.

Leaving Holland at 5 a.m. and arriving in Lubbock, Texas at 2 a.m. the next day isn't exactly my idea of an exciting way to spend one's time, but that's what Sandra did. Nervousness, anxiety, a little homesickness, and excitement were just a few of the feelings gushing through her mind as she crossed the Atlantic last August.

Sandra is from Vries, Holland, where she grew up on a farm with lots of sheep, horses, ducks and other animals. She is the temporary daughter of George and Andrea Frye, whom she refers to as "Mom" and "Dad." She began corresponding with the Frye family in May of last year. Letters, phone calls, and one picture gave Sandra a small but secure idea of what to expect when she arrived in Friona. She came to Friona on Wednesday, August 21. On Friday evening, she was to attend her first party, the freshman-senior girls initiation party.

The only problem was that no one thought to tell her that the mild "hazing," as you might call it, was a tradition. Sandra remembers the thoughts that were going through her head, "I saw what they were doing to those poor girls, and I thought to myself, 'These senior girls are supposed to be my friends?' I felt sorry for the freshmen." Now she understands and as she is reminded of that night, she laughs about it.

Sandra enjoyed a week and a half of summer band rehearsals, American dinners, the "Texas" play, and sleep, but then it was time for school to start. Sandra really enjoys school, even though she's already graduated from high school in Holland. Her classes include Band, Home and Family Living, American History, Geometry, Spanish I, Journalism and Health. She says that her favorites are Band and Geometry.

Sandra marched with the band during the football season while she played the flute. "Actually, I was just moving my fingers and not really playing, but I was having fun," Sandra says.

Recently, Sandra, along with the other band members, took a trip to Dallas. "I had so much fun!" Sandra exclaimed. "I was scared of some of the rides at Six Flags (I only rode the train and the parachutes), but I loved Wet 'n Wild! It was great!" She came home with a sunburn and a bruise on her eye from a brief rendezvous

Sandra has been quite busy this year with her other activities, as well. She sings with the Trebelaires, attends the First Baptist Church, and has been active with the Thespians, FHA, and the Foreign Language Club. She says she loves to sing, and "We're (the Trebelaires) having a recital Sunday, and I'm very excited about it." She went snow skiing for the first time this February at Crested Butte, Colorado with a church group. "I love to ski. I had never done it before, but it was fun!" Sandra has also had the opportunity to attend concerts by Amy Grant and George Strait. She has become a fan of both singers since she's been in America. She was also in the high school musical this past fall. She felt that participating in the "Music Man" enabled her to meet and get to know many of the kids a little better. Being in FHA has helped her to meet and get to know many of the girls in high school, as well.

Sandra enjoys meeting and being with people. You can tell by the way she acts, but she says the one bad thing about the Americans that she has met is that some of them ask some quite peculiar questions. For example, "Have you ever watched T.V. before?" "Do you have cars in Holland?" "Do you know what electricity is?" Sandra giggles a bit and says, "I guess some people don't know anything about any country besides the United States."

Sandra misses her mother, father, and brother a great deal. However, she was able to fly to San Francisco to meet her father at the end of February. She said she had a wonderful time. Sandra's father owns a mustard factory, so he travels to America from time to time selling his product.

The fields of tulips are in bloom in Holland this time of year because they bloom later there than they do here. Sandra misses many things about her home country and especially her family as they are all very close. But Sandra has thoroughly enjoyed staying with the Frye family.

"I love them very much," Sandra says, "and I hope I'll get to see them again someday." When the Fryes sent Sandra a family picture, along with the name of everyone in the photo, Sandra couldn't believe that anybody would name their child "Kip." "You see, in Holland, 'kip' means 'chicken,'" she explains. Sandra also said, "I would like to thank everybody who helped me. I've really enjoyed being in Friona. I hope that I will have the chance to show you my country someday."

After school is out, Sandra will stay in Friona until June 11. Then she will go on a trip with other foreign exchange students to Washington, D.C., Nashville, Cape Canaveral, Disney World, Myrtle Beach, as well as several other places. She says, "I'm looking forward to Disney World and Myrtle Beach because I love to swim. The trip is expensive, but my father keeps telling me that when I get home, we may have to live in the slums, but at least I'll be able to say that I've seen America."
