Time Will Tell

Last June 24 United Nations planes in Korea suddenly started bombing North Korean targets that had been "off limits" up to that time. They went after the big power plants near the Yalu River. It was the signal for a step-up in the Allied effort to cripple the enemy.

They have been at it more than four months now, and it's fair to examine the results. Gen. Mark Clark's intelligence staff, in a summing-up released to the magazine U. S. News and World Report, declares that North Korea's power web is virtually parayzed and its industry almost completely shut down. In addition, railroads have been reduced to two per cent of their normal operations.

Intelligence accounts say we did so much damage to power installations that the North Korean communications system collapsed. Radio stations had to go off the air. Small generator units helped restore some service. But right now little power is available for lighting, irrigation is drastically curbed and industry is suffering heavily.

Most big plants had been wiped off the mas earlier in the war. This time hundreds of small factories and repair shops are taking the blow. The food supply and much war material formerly produced in North Korea now must he brought in from outside sources.

Yet all this has not affected seriously the condition and morale of Communist armies in the field. They are better fed than ever, adequately equipped and well clothed.

Partly this may be due to the lag in the effect of Allied blows. Possibly there will be less materiel in the Red pipe lines a few months hence. For another thing, police state organization permits every available scrap of food and equipment to be brought to bear on the war situation, which Eisenhower's plane will have maintain a complete news blackout. ers. There's a beautiful public course thus minimizing the impact of the damage. And, finally, to take from Japan to Korea. Russia and China well may have stepped up aid to the Chinese and North Korean forces to compensate for economic losses in the bombing zones.

The next few months should tell the tale. If air bombardment really can cut seriously into a combatant's strength in the field, the evidence ought to begin to be felt before long. So far it's an inconclusive story.





So now ponds are dry streams do not run, wells have gone dry and there is a lack of drinking water everywhere. Farmers have to haul water to livestock, for household uses and for drinking. Trucks containing every type of water-holding device fill many of the roads. Water cattle is hauled in from the nearest point where it is available and poured by hand into field tanks. Thousands of beef cattle have been sold off prematurely because there isn't enough feed and water. Farmers are "dusting in" their wheat hoping for late Fall rains. Housewives use water as sparingly as possible. Many do the family laundry only once in two weeks.. Fire is a continuous nightmare for small towns that no water systems.
