





Notable Voting Record

For the first time since 1940, the American people turned out at the polls in numbers which suggested they understood what a great privilege and responsibility it is

Almost complete figures show that close to 60,000,000 Americans cast their ballots for President. That total is roughly 80 per cent of the 75,000,000 who were registered, and some 62 per cent of the 97,000,000 eligible citizens.

Excellent as that showing was, however, it did not quite equal that of 1940, when 49,800,000 voted out of an eligible total of 79,400,000. In other words, taking into account the increased U.S. population since then, we did not go to the polls in quite the same proportion as in

In some areas and localities, the turnout was far more spectacular than the national average indicates. New York City, for example, got out 96 per cent of its registered vote, and the state as a whole sent 90 per cent of the registered total. In Virginia, around 88 per cent came out, and in Maryland, about 82.

If the percentage of eligible voters be taken as the real test, we still fall considerably short of many European countries on performance. But there are at least two factors which excuse us slightly in any comparison.

We have such frequently stiff obstacles as state-bystate registration requirements, of which a year's residence is usually the toughest feature. Being a highly mobile people in a land 3,500 miles wide, we always have a substantial number who simply cannot meet the residence test.





Q-Four aces are melded with two wild cards. Finally a fifth ace is drawn and the player puts it down with a third wild card. This play is not noticed until the next turn, and it is then ruled that the meld is not counted as a canasta because of the third wild card.

Is the offending side permitted to play extra aces on this fouled canasta? May the offending side take the discard pile with the fouled canasta if an ace is discarded? May the offending side go out by adding a fourth wild card to the fouled canasta?

'A-It is correct to treat the meld as a fouled canasta. This means that it will not receive the normal canasta bonus. For every other purpose, however, it is treated as a canasta.

Thus, in Samba, you could not take the discard pile with this meld if your opponent at your right dis-carded an ace. You could add extra natural aces form your hand, but this would not be a wise play in most cases; you'd be better off start-ing a new meld of aces if you could

You could not add a fourth wild card to the meld whether or not this helped your meld out. If you accidentally put too many cards into a meld, that's too bad You pay the penalty and you try to look cheerful about it.

There is never any excuse, however, for deliberately breaking the rules of a game even if you are

ready to pay the penalty.

Q-Only one card is left in the stock pile. The player draws this card and wants to know whether or not she must discard. That last card happened to be a king.

A—She must discard even thoug

she has dawn only one card. This is counted as a regular draw, and the regular rule applies. Q—A player has a six-card run on the table and adds a seventh counted as a regular draw, and card to it, completing the samba. She accidentally puts down an

eighth card on the sequence, but this is immediately noticed and called. Is the samba fouled, or can A—There is still time to correct this illegal meld. The play must use the eighth card in another meld or discard it at once. The
