

# Of India Plan **Produces Rift**

Then they prepared to battle for a clear decision in an urgent 21-nation meeting here Sunday night.

A U. S. spokesman said the U. S. tried to get Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden to agree to far-reaching changes

in the Indian resolution. The U.S. wants to spell out in unmistakable terms the machinery for repatriation of war prisoners that would prevent their forcible return to Communist zones at any time. President-elect Dwight D. Eisenhower has endorsed the principle laid down by the outgoing Truman Adminis-

The U. S. position was presented to Eden and British Minister of State Selwyn Lloyd by U. S. Delegate Ernest Gross at a meeting of nore than an hour in Eden's New York hotel suite. Gross outlined the U. S. position on direct instructions from Secretary of State Dean Ache-

The British insisted that the Indian proposal for a repatriation commission was enough and made it clear they will push for its approval instead of the 21-nation resolution sponsored by the U.S. and co-sponsored by 20 other countries, including Britain.

The U. S. spokesman after the meeting said that the "U. S. could not go along with the abrupt abandonment by Britain of the 21-power



Before repainting the exterior of his house, the home-owner should understand the technique of handling old paint failures, such as peeling paint.

Considerable areas of the paint may be peeling, badly blistered or cracked. In such a case, it is possible that all the old paint for Casement Windows eventually will deteriorate. Therefore, it should all be removed, for applying new paint will not bind the old paint to the surface, and

Paint failures, including peeling AMERICAN WINDOW CO. may result from many causes, such as inferior quality of paint used; use of wrong paint on particular surface to be covered and others

Peeling usually is the result of paint being applied to damp or wet wood, since moisture prevents paint from properly bonding with, or griping, the surface. Moisture may enter walls through roof leaks; poorly joined corner, windows and doors; or cracks in the siding.

Peeled paint should be scraped from the surface before a new coat is applied, or it will continue peel off with it, eaution Colorizer paint authorities.

There are several methods for complete paint removal. It can be done with a blowtorch (especially if the old coat of peeling paint is thick) or with one of the new electric paint-removing tools. The heat quickly softens the paint so that it can be removed with a wide putty knife or scraping knife. The blow torch is held in one hand and the scraping knife in the other. The flame passing over the surface causes the paint to bubble and curl and while softened it is scraped off with the knife. There is no fire danger with an electric tool, but with a blow-torch, caution should b

taken. A chemical paint-remover may organic solvent-type remover. may be either liquid or paste. The paste remover usually is appropriate for ordinary jobs. It is usually spread on over the old paint, allowed to remain until it and the softened paint together can be scrap

#### Housing Research Revolution' Is New Institute Goal

WASHINGTON- What research physics and scores of other science ne standards may be duplicated soon in the still unexplored field of modern, mid-20th Century housing. The National Association of Home Builders took the first big step toward that goal with the formation stitute" to coordinate the scattered housing research now under way and to conduct practical field tests on new materials and techniques developed in university and indus-

trial laboratories. Creation of the new organization is expected to give tremendous impetus to all basic housing research and to speed up the technological revolution which has transformed home building since World War II from a handicraft to a \$12 billion a year mass-production industry.

The Institute charter was approved by the NAHB Board of Direc-

tors at its September meeting in Seattle, as an outgrowth of the technical and research activities of the association, whose 25,000 members account for 80 per cent of all residential construction in metropolitan areas of the United States Headed by Leonard G. Haeger technical services director of NAHB. the Institute's activities will guided by a nine-man board of trustees chosen from among the na-tion's leading builders.

In addition to its own studies and field trials, the Institute will provide the nation's home builders for the first time with a central clearing home of title information on new developments by governmental and private research mental and private research organ izations. It also will advise thos oarganizations on practical prob-lems faced by the home builder guide their research

MUNICH. GERMANY -(P)-German Himalayan expedition is preparing quietly here to scale the great Nanga Parbat peak as Germany again takes up the threads of its war-disrupted ventures into scientific achievement.

Dr. Karl von Krauss, chairman of the society which plans to launch its first expedition in 1958, stresses that the program is one aimed at science only. In chosing the 28,653foot-high Nanga Parbat, the Germans have picked a mountain which already has turned back the best of German Alpinists. Thus far the expedition includes nine climbers.

Four previous German, attempts failed to scale the peak, located where the borders of Russia, China and India meet. Last to find defeat at the hands of the towering Him-
