The old idea that a good child could be raised only by frequent spankings and punishment has died a well-deserved death. Personally, I do not agree with those who believe that a child never should be spanked or punished, but, on the of the parents toward other hand, too strict discipline is other hand, too strict discipline is more likely to do harm than good. Furthermore, many children who are behaving badly really are suffering 'rom some physical disorder or nervous maladjustment for which punishment often is the worst possible treatment.

The fault often is-but not always derstanding of the youngster's probwith the physical condition or the home or school surroundings rather than with the willful misbehavior of the youngster.

Before labeling a youngster as a spite of intelligent efforts on the behavior-problem case or as just simply "bad," every effort should be made to find the cause of the trouble and remove of remedy it.

Lack of sympathy and understanding on the part of one or both parents is a common cause. To disconnect, she grasps the lever with her teeth. the slight pull of this biting motion is sufficient to break the circuit.

Her two sons, Hank, eight, Johnnie, five, look up numbers for her A list of important ones is pasted on the back of her respirator mirror. These include fire, police and other emergency numbers, so that she can safely be left alone for reasonable periods of time.

"This has given me my first feeling of independence in three years," she said Monday "I order the groceries by phone. I order the children's clothing by phone. If they aren't right, I send them back. I even tell the barber how I want him to cut Johnnie's hair.'




