

Reds Prefer War

Whatever plan now emerges from the United Nations in the broad effort to gain a settlement of the Korean war, the Russians already have shown to all free world capitals their preference for war over peace. The leaves of the Soviet olive branch have withered, exposing a tangle of barbed wire underneath.

Evidently the UN is bent on pushing ahead to approval of some sort of truce proposal, probably rooted in the Indian plan for repatriation of Communist prisoners, which was the issue on which the Panmunjom talks finally snagged. But the Soviet Union seems to have doomed this plan in advance, and by that fact to have revealed Moscow's purpose of continued war.

Foreign Minister Vishinsky accomplished this feat, following a puzzling strategy and a mystifying timetable that could delight only the enemies of his government.

For, in denouncing the Indian proposal in the UN, he went far to heal a developing breach between the United States and Britain-the very sort of rift the Kremlin reportedly is anxious to foster. And he dealt a stiff blow at the neutralisms which pervades many countries and dominates such governments as Nehru's in India.
