



mers have been told by Presi-t-elect Eisenhower he has not armulated a long-range policy on agricultural legislation but they can be sure any help will not in-terfere with their freedom of ac-

.The assurance was given in a message Eisenhower sent to the American Farm Bureau Federation president, Allen B, Kline. The federation is holding its annual convention here. Eisenhower said he recognized

that government must help farmers achieve a stabilized prosperity but he did not specify how he thought this might be done. He indicated a hope the matter could be decided by the time the present law supporting basic agricultural commodities through 1954 expires.

"I hope," he said, "that during next two years the conditions ting rural welfare will be thoroughly analyzed and that possible solutions will be discussed in meetings wherever rural people come together.

"The conclusions developed in such nation-wide discussions should in time be expressed to the appropriate committees of Congress and to the membership of the agricul-tural advisory commission which we

are pledged to establish.

The Farm Bureau members are expected to adopt their recommendations regarding farm supports Thursday at closing sessions of the four-day meeting, which is being attended by 5,000 members.

The present law supports the price of major commodities at 90 per cent of parity.

To tell us about the workings of our federal government, we have government press officers by the hundreds. Yet there is a strong feeling that we don't learn enough about what really goes on in Washintgon.

Robert Ramspeck, chairman of the U.S. Civil Service Commission, thinks we ought to have a complete, nonpolitical study of the work done by government information men. It sounds like a good idea.

Since the problems of the various departments vary so greatly, we should not expect to find—nor should we demand-a high degree of uniformity in information practices. Obviously the State Department, the Defense Department and the Atomic Energy Commission cannot, be looked to for the kind of information policies we might anticipate in the Interior Department. Vital secrets must

Still, we do have the right to expect from all departments a sincere effort to disclose to the American people every bit of information essential to their understanding of the government's activities, so long as it does not jeop-

There isn't any convincing evidence that we are getting that sort of help from information officers today. Here and there an extremely competent press aide turns British, vigorously opposing any ex- fense, and top military advisers. up. But too many deal in calculated vagueness.
