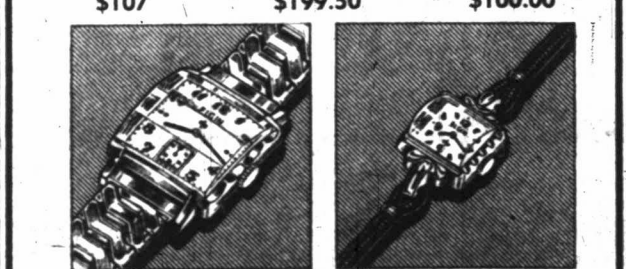

The eight industry members of the regional Wage Stabilization Board here resigned Wednesday following action on application of industry members of several factories about 25,000 workers over other regional boards.

Regional WSB Chairman Byron R. Abernathy said applications now being processed and not yet ready for WSB action would affect several times the 25,000 workers.

The industry members of Region 10—covering Texas, Oklahoma, Arkansas and Louisiana—quit in protest over recent soft coal wage cuts by President Truman.

The statement of resignation said the industry members believed "no

## FROM RAGS TO RICHES TO RAGS— Loaded Lads Really Whoop It Up As Money Runs Free

OKLAHOMA CITY—(AP)—Every one has a yen to live like a millionaire. And no one had the desire more than two young Oklahoma City brothers.

The boys, age 11 and 12, found temptation too much of a foe as they sat near a woman with a bulging purse Monday night at the Bethel Center. Later, when they looked inside the purse, they found what appeared to be a million dollars—or, even better, \$100 cold cash.

**\$2 For Kisses**

The next day they skipped to school loaded. Police, recapping their adventure, said they threw handfuls of dollar bills in the air and watched their schoolmates scramble for money.

One of them tipped a playmate \$1.25 for a shoeshine. He also handed a lad a quarter to brush his coat.

As the day wore on, and spending money became dull, the 12-year-old found a way to liven things up. He gave a girl \$2 for four kisses.

The brothers handed a schoolmate a \$20 bill and ordered: "Here, son. Go get me some change." When the friend returned he was tipped \$5 for his trouble.

Hot dog stands in the neighborhood suddenly found they were doing a banner business. At one point the boys got brave enough to ask their homeroom teacher if they could throw a big Christmas party. The suspicious teacher turned thumbs down on the proposal.

When the boys ran out of cash they also ran out of friends. By that time police had been informed of the spending spree and collared them.

The father promised full restitution, but the police decided they would get back as much money as they could. Juvenile Officer G. E. Bailey reported so far they have collected \$14.90.

One boy, he said, had only a nickel left—but he generously returned it. Several others also explained they already had spent their money.

In the meantime, the young millionaires found themselves penniless, friendless and facing the wrath of their angry father.

## Final Segregation Arguments Heard Before High Court

WASHINGTON —(AP)—Southern reaction to a possible Supreme Court order ending racial segregation in public schools has become a major point of dispute in Supreme Court arguments on the constitutionality of separate schools for white and negro students.

The Supreme Court, due to wind up three days of arguments Thursday, heard conflicting views Wednesday in cases involving separate school systems in South Carolina, Kansas and Virginia.

Still to be argued Thursday were cases involving Delaware and the District of Columbia.

**17 States Affected**

The high court ruling, which may come next Spring, will affect not only the five areas whose cases are being argued, but 17 states in all which require completely or partly separate school systems for white and negro children, and four where segregation is permitted.

John W. Davis, arguing for South Carolina's separate school system, said abolition of segregation in that state "is something that we cannot contemplate with entire equanimity."

Thurgood Marshall, special counsel for the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People said he doesn't believe the people of South Carolina are "lawless."

"I believe," the negro attorney told the court, "the rank and file of the people in the South will observe whatever decision is handed down."

**'Separate But Equal'**

Other attorneys, representing states involved in the litigation, stressed heavily an 1896 doctrine, which holds that dual school systems are constitutional if they are equal.

But Marshall and attorneys on the opposing side insisted, with equal vigor that the Constitution does not permit states to impose segregation in public schools. They rely chiefly on the equal protection clause of the 14th Amendment, and contend there can be no equality as long as there is segregation.

Davis argued it was inconceivable that Congress, in submitting the 14th Amendment to the states for ratification, intended it to outlaw racial segregation in public schools.

### Tug Lands Ship's Skipper After Threat Of Scuttling

HALIFAX, N. S. —(AP)—Capt. Adnan Graetz, Israeli shipmaster who threatened to sink his vessel unless his father were given a post in Israel's Cabinet, was landed here Wednesday night and taken to a hotel. Officials described him as "mentally ill."

The 24-year-old captain was removed from the 5,600-ton freighter Abraham Graetz at the request of the vessel's owners and her agents here. Immigration officials said he would be "treated as a sick mariner."

The freighter, carrying a crew of 35 Israelis and five others, was expected to come into port here. It sailed December 6 from New York for Canadian ports and Israel.

Young Graetz was taken off the freighter without incident 16 miles off Halifax by the U.S. Coast Guard Foundation. The tug's master, Capt. Fred Turner, said Graetz appeared "quite normal" during conversation while the tug was returning to port.

Last Saturday, in a radio message to Israeli Premier David Ben-Gurion, Graetz threatened to sink the ship unless his father was given the job of minister of communications. The ship's radio operator reported Graetz was holding him at pistol point.

## Attendance Contrast Shown In Midland Schools Report

A slight increase in the percentage of attendance in the white Midland public schools was shown in the second six weeks period for this year as compared with last year. Supt. Frank Monroe reported Wednesday.

The percentage was 92.96 for the second six-weeks period this year. Last year for the same period, the percentage was 92.03.

A total of 7,908 students attend the white schools during the second six weeks period this year, an increase of 1,059.

In the negro schools, a considerable decline in attendance was shown, with the attendance being only 84.21 per cent for the second six weeks period this year as compared with 92.81 last year. A total of 777 students attended the negro schools for the period this year, an increase of 124.

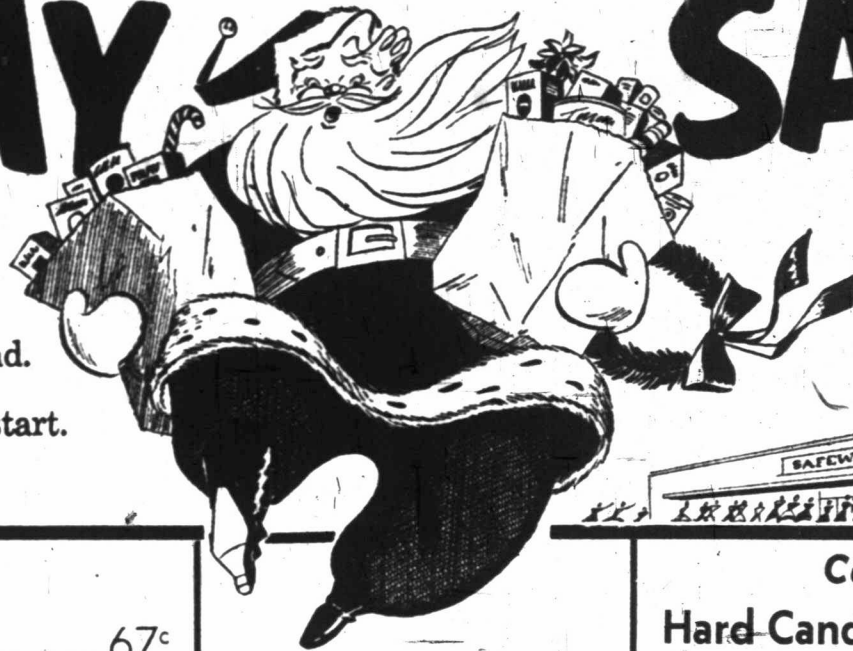

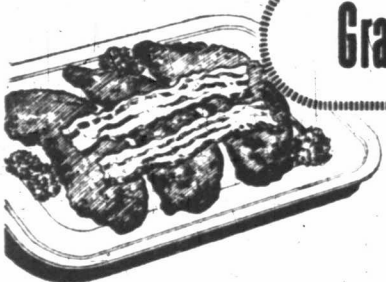

Beside tables, lipsticks and fresh dresses are not listed among the medical treatments for mental patients. But they are an important ingredient in recovery.

Falling plaster, crowded rooms, sagging beds, poorly-arranged wards—these things hinder progress.

Knowing this, the Board for Texas State Hospitals and Special Schools has listed a modern construction and renovation program as Item 5 in the 14 points.

**Plans Approved**  
Buildings have been examined and approval of plans for new buildings have been established. A number of projects have been completed.

But future planning calls for replacing old and outmoded buildings, for constructing new treatment and receiving units, for designing future construction to meet specific medical needs.

Future plans, if carried out, will mean quicker recoveries, less money spent per patient.

Renovation is an important part of the hospital program.

# Nurse Anesthetists Hold Unique, Important Position In Hospital Here

Three young women in Midland probably have put more people to sleep in this Permian Basin city than any combination of mothers or baby-sitters here. Since July, 1930 Jo Betty Donald, Mary Harrington, and Martha Pope have served men doctors, has been brought peaceful slumber to more

than 4,800 residents of Midland and surrounding areas as part of their jobs.

The trio are registered nurse anesthetists, an unpronounceable name that delineates them as the elite of the nursing profession. The field of anesthesia, formerly a prerogative of men doctors, has been invaded by women since 1933 to the

extent that there are now 6,000 female anesthetists, members of the American Association of Nurse Anesthetists.

A heavy responsibility rests on the skilled hands of the nurse anesthetist. As Miss Donald expresses it, "You have to use your head while giving general anesthesia." During an operation, the life of the

patient is both literally and figuratively in the charge of the nurse administering the anesthetic to the unconscious patient.

**Know Every Breath**

"You know practically every breath the patient takes, and every heart beat that is made; and you must be constantly on the alert," said Miss Harrington, illustrating the work of the nurse anesthetist.

All three of the young women work at the Midland Memorial Hospital here. Miss Donald is the senior anesthetist of the group, and she has been at the hospital since it first opened its doors. The trio may work separately or in pairs on a case, but rarely, if ever, are all three of them required for duty on a single operation.

Long hours and the extra year of special nursing training are given by the three women as the principal reasons for the tremendous shortage of nurse anesthetists. More than 14,000 new trainees are needed in the calling, and hospitals everywhere are virtually begging for more nurse anesthetists to enter the field.

**Like Their Work**

A look at the typical hours of the three women at Midland Memorial Hospital reveals the exacting demands of their work. Each week two of them are on duty approximately 114 hours, with the time "on call" included. The third nurse anesthetist works 48 hours, with the schedule varied to give each one an equal amount of time off duty.

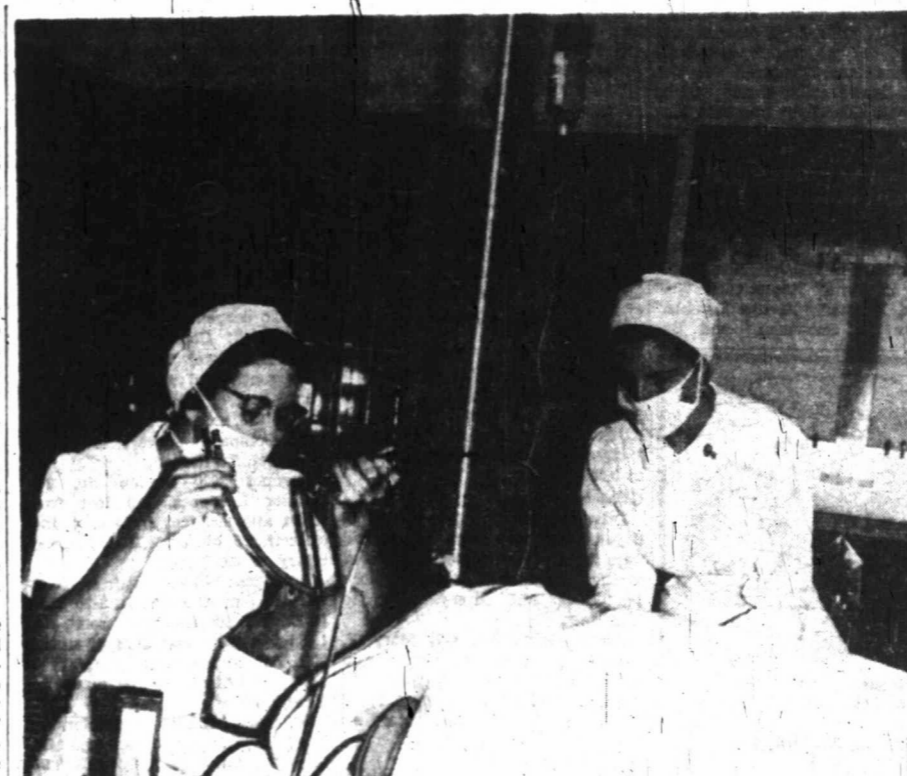
And yet, in spite of the long hours, the trio like their work. As Miss Donald stated, "I enjoy my work because it presents a challenge—every case of anesthesia is different in some way."

A shortage of money for the additional year of training needed to prepare a nurse for the anesthesia field was given by Miss Donald as one reason why not enough girls are becoming anesthetists.

**No Patients Lost**

In all the years of the vital work, none of the three anesthetists have lost a patient on the operating table, an enviable record considering the thousands of individuals that they have put to sleep. And yet, the time a patient is "kept under" ranges from five minutes to seven hours, and from minor surgical corrections to complex cases.

Obstetrical and surgical work make up the bulk of the work requiring the services of the nurse anesthetists. About 15 to 20 per cent of the cases they are called in on are emergencies, such as accident victims, personnel injured in oil well drilling work, and appendectomies. From 200 to 250 hospital patients each month come un-

der the care of the three nurses. Young and old patients are handled in much the same way by the trio in administering anesthetics. Miss Harrington, as an example, had two cases on the same day, one a two-week-old baby boy, and the other an 86-year-old woman patient.

anesthetic administered. Ether is used rarely now, but it still remains as a standard to judge the efficiency of anesthetics. However, vinylene, a new form of ether is now being used on children because it is fast-acting and more pleasant.

The anesthetists do not give spinal anesthetics, which are injected solely by doctors, but they stand by in cases requiring spinals. Sodium pentathol, cyclo-propane, and occasionally curare, the South American poisonous drug, are their principal tools. Curare is used in conjunction with the first two anesthetics, as it aids in relaxing the muscles.

Most of the operations are performed in the morning. The nurse anesthetists ordinarily report for work at 7 a.m. and finish their cases at 1 p.m., although they frequently will stay at the hospital until 3 or 4 p.m. And constant emergencies make them slaves to the telephone when they are "on call."
