In the negro schools, a considerable decline in attendance was shown, with the attendance being only 84.31 per cent for the second six weeks period this year as compared with 92.01 last year. A total of 777 students attended the negro schools for the period this year. an increase of 124.



Political Campaign Costs

The current House investigation into campaign spending should prove one of the most useful inquiries in many years. The 1952 presidential contest showed emphatically how outdated are the present laws governing political ex-

Under existing statutes each national party, committee is limited to a \$3,000,000 outlay per campaign. In practice, the major parties long ago found the way to get around this handicap. Auxiliary citizens' groups volunteer committees, subsidiaries of established organizations like labor unions, these and others collect and disburse campaign funds of their own.

They, too, naturally are restricted by the \$3,000,000 ceiling for particular committees, but the sum of their operations can and usually does exceed measurably the total for the official party organization.

The legal limit, prescribed in 1939, obviously has been unrealistic for some years. The 1952 campaign reduced it to absurdity.

work at the Midland Memorial Hospital here. Miss Donald is the senior anesthetist of the group, and she has been at the hospital since it first opened its doors. The trio may work separately or in pairs on a case, but rarely, if ever, are all three of them required for duty on a single operation.

Long hours and the extra year of special nursing training are given by the three women as the principal reasons for the tremendous shortage of nurse anesthetists. More than 14,000 new trainees are needed in the calling, and hospitals everywhere are virtually begging for more nurse anesthetists to enter the field. Like Their Work

A look at the typical hours of the three women at Midland Memorial Hospital reveals the exacting demands of their work. Each week two of them are on duty approximately 114 hours, with the time "on call" included. The third nurse anesthetist works 48 hours, with the schedule varied to give each one an equal amount of time off duty

And yet, in spite of the long hours, the trio like their work. As Miss Donald stated, "I enjoy my work because it presents a chaldifferent in some way."




