"Lightning
"Lightning is particularly
common with spring and summer
thunderstorms in thunderstorms in Texas, so individuals should take certain precautions during
weather," advises Dr. ${ }^{\text {stormy }}$ Gary Nelson, a safety engineer with the Texas Agricultural Extension
Service, The Texas A\&M University System. "Quick thinking combined with
common sense can go a long way in preventing lightning fatalities when thunderstorms are on
prowl," Nelson emphasizes. He lists some "dos" "Hon'ts" lists some "dos" and
