Basketball's new free throw rule, which has created a stir among the college coaches, doesn't get a unanimous vote of approval from Midland hardwood headmen either. Briefly, the new rule allows a player who is fouled

anytime preceding the final three minutes to take one shot. If he misses, he tries again; that's the "one-one," as coaches have dubbed the rule. A played fouled in the act of making shot still gets his two charity tosses as in the past.

It also is law that in the final three minutes all offended players get two gift tosses, regardless; and taking the ball out of bounds has

In short, the rule is designed to cut down on fouling. "That's why I'm for it," Coach Red Rutledge of the Bulldogs said. "I don't like to see the boys fouling."

He explained that the one-one part of the rule was the best part but that he didn't especially care for the two compulsory shots during the final three minutes.

On the other hand, Kenny Jastrow of the Phillips 66ers said, definitely "We don't like it," meaning the one-one edict. He suggested that it took away a lot of the action during first and middle parts of the

Jastrow stands behind the rule that no team can take the ball out of bounds. And, "I think the rule is okay in the last three minutes, too, because it values the foul more."

A team that is ahead and in possession at the last of the game is more able to protect its lead by taking the free throws, he said, but a losing team still has a chance because it gets possession if the tosses

As for the Rotary Engineers of Midland, "Some of them like it, some don't," Jack Locke said. It still is a little early in the season to be definitely for or against it.

# Ike's Organizational Set-Up

From time to time during the presidential campaign, General Eisenhower was criticized because he always had operated as an executive through the military, "chain-ofcommand" system. The suggestion was that this way of doing not only was worthless but might even be a dangerous handicap to a civilian executive.

Under this arrangement, Eisenhower customarily relied heavily on his chiefs of staff in his periods of most notable service. In World War II, Gen. Walter Bedell Smith, now head of the Central Intelligence Agency, filled that spot for Ike. In his tenure with NATO, the general leaned on Gen. Alfred M. Gruenther.

Eisenhower's selection of Gov. Sherman Adams of New Hampshire to be his chief assistant in the White House discloses the general's evident intent to repeat the pattern. Adams served virtually in the capacity of personal chief of staff to Ike throughout the campaign. In that role he won the general's supreme confidence.

It is fair to ask, therefore, whether the prospect of this organizational set-up really is so frightening as some critics of "a military man in the White House" hinted.
