BEIRUT, LEBANON-(AP)-Twenty passengers, possessed with fear after 24 hours of buffeting aboard the stricken liner Champollion, died Tuesday in a desperate effort to swim ashore through frenzied seas. Fifty others who jumped from the ship made shore safely.

Ten more deaths occurred when a lifeboat capsized.

The French liner was aground with a wide split across her middle on a reef only 500 yards off shore. Misinterpreta-tion of shore beacons landed her there early Monday.

Western military experts are pretty well agreed now that the Allies were taken in when they accepted the Communists' bid for truce talks in Korea back in 1951. The evidence suggests overwhelmingly that the Reds had no real thought of a truce pact, but used the talks as a screen for a termendous buildup of manpower and material in North Korea.

What is not so generally realized, however, is that the Reds are getting direct military advantage out of the very sites of the truce talks, especially Kaesong, the original one.

The Kaesong area, according to reliable accounts from correspondents in the vicinity, is serving as a center for several command posts. It also is being used for a number of large supply dumps. Lying within the established neutral zone, these headquarters and these dumps enjoy 100 per cent protection from UN attack!

Worse than this, the Reds have in recent times been parking artillery pieces near the borders of the Kaesong zone, knowing they are safe there from return fire, since answering bombardment might go astray and land in
