



College Outlook Brightens

America's colleges and universities have been ailing financially almost since the end of World War II. Their revenues haven't risen fast enough to keep pace with soaring costs.

The pinch already has squeezed many small schools out of business, and many more are perilously close to the edge. Even among the large institutions few can be found which feel more than half-way secure.

Inflation naturally has hiked the cost of everything the school does. Its impact has been magnified by the fact that a lot of the money that comes to the colleges can't be used to pay overhead expenses like coal and light bills and ignitor service

Tuition fees can be used that way, but they cover only part of the burden. And these fees already have been boosted so high in the postwar period they can't be intreased much more without discouraging enrollments.

Most schools, big and small, rely chiefly upon endowments and other types of financial grants to provide expanding revenue sources. But, taxes being what they are the big grants aren't so common any more.
