Dulles Terms Stalin's Death **Boon To Peace**

State John Foster Dulles said Monday the death of Stalin had increased the world's chance for peace.

Dulles, in his first news conference at the UN since becoming secretary of State, said Stalin's death, however, would not bring any changes in U.S. policy.

He said the U. S. would+ continue to follow the course it, has in the cold war, but that, with Stalin dead, that course would have more chance of

He told a group of correspondents representing countries from all over the world that Stalin had put a damper on man's aspirations for peace and the enjoyment of human rights, and said he doubted any successor to the Red dictator would have the prestige to do so as effec-

Dulles said the death of Stalin to the realization of the peaceful aims set forth in the UN Charter and those countries supporting those aims now could achieve success and greater realization of UN aims. to questions.

"For 10 years the world has be

dominated by the malignant power of Stalin. He capitalized on the prestige which was won by the Red army defenders of Stallingrad, and when the Red armies moved into Eastern Europe, Stallin used them to establish his Communist satellite regimes. In Asia, Stalin's plans, laid 25 years ago, achieved a dramatic success through the Communist civil war which brought 450,000,000 Chinese under Stalin's

"Now Stalin is dead. He cannot bequeath to anyone his prestige.

"As Stalin dies, General Eisenhower, the man who liberated Western Europe, has become President of our great republic, with a pres-tige unmatched in history. A new



As the world looks back now upon Joseph Stalin's long chronicle of tyranny, some men will rise and say his greatest crime was that he corrupted a "good faith"—the original communism of the Soviet pioneers.

These are the men who do not understand the nature of totalitarianism. These are the men who although they may have consciously rejected communism, still find themselves subconsciously captivated by the ideals of cooperation for human betterment which it professes.

This lingering attraction blinds them to the fact that communism never was a good faith.

It never was a good faith because it inevitably had to sanction violence in the enforcement of the "cooperation" it exalted. When the government runs the country's whole life, it cannot tolerate for long any marked interference with its plans. If a plan is to work, it must be accepted by all. There is no room for dissenters.

Communism never was a good doctrine, furthermore, because it called for the concentration of power in the hands of a few-acting in the name of all. Yet it took no account of how power inescapably corrodes the souls and

This is its great central weakness. It ignores the realities of the human quest for power that marks the aflittle man from Missouri, newly front-by saying:





In this case South's hope is rewarded. He gets away with his three top clubs and can ruff his last club in dummy. He therefore succeeds in naking his game contract.
