# Newfoundland **WoodmenFind** Only 10 Bodies

Air Force planes crashed in Newfoundland Wednesday. All 33 men aboard the two planes were believed dead, including an Air Force general.

A giant 10-engine bomber, an RB-36, hit a hilltop on the isolated East Coast of Newfoundland. It carried 23 men, including Brig. Gen. Richard E. Ellsworth, 42, Erie,

Pa., commanding general of the Rapid City, S. D., Air Base. Woodmen found 10 bodies Thursday near the wreckage of the plane - a version of the B-36 able to deliver blows from bases in the U. S. to almost any point in the world.

A U. S. Superfortress with a crew of 10 crashed in St. George's Bay, about 290 miles across Newfoundland from St. John's on the West Coast. on the West Coast. Searchers found only wreckage

and no survivors in the bay, first reports said. Both planes were on training flights.

Ground parties combed through

the wreckage of the RB-36 for ad-ditional bodies. The woodsmen had hacked their vay through bushland and clambered over deep snowbanks to reach the wreckage in a near-trackless area about 50 miles north of here. They reported no immediate trace of the other 13 persons aboard the plane, which crashed enroute from the Azores to its base at Rapid City,

#### Pioneer Asks CAB For Aid As Red Ink Appears In Ledgers

WASHINGTON -P Pioneer Airlines, declaring its working capital is "completely exhausted" and payments are coming due to its creditors, asked the Civil Aeronau-

tics Board for help Wednesday. The line asked CAB for an emergency lump-sum mail payment of \$846,000 and a \$100,000 a month increase in its mail rate. Pioneer said it needs this to continue operating temporarily, even under reduced schedules and personnel.

The air line has pending with CAB a request for reconsideration of the board's order of last Friday setting Pioneer's permanent rates for air mail at figures much lower than the air line had expected.

If the emergency temporary pay denied. Pioneer wants authority to suspend operations temporarily its entire system "to avert continuing losses pending a decision on the petition for reconsider-

The two petitions filed Wednesday said Fioneer is unable to get additional loans "from any source at this time, under the circumstances." #### Malenkov Must Prove Himself

'Caesar has no heirs.'

The expression means that a despot's power cannot really be transferred to a successor. The man who comes after must earn the power in his own right.

This is as true of Russia after Stalin as it is of any tyranny in history. Georgi Malenkov officially has donned the late dictator's mantle. But that does not automatically clothe him with the same authority.

The very magnitude of Stalin's power, enhanced by the myth of his unsurpassed greatness and perfection, meant that none of the competitors for his place could have anything like his stature so long as he lived.

Stalin was master of the Communist Party, the Soviet government, the secret police and the Red Army.

Malenkov, his designated successor, is presumed master only of the party and government machinery. This is no minor advantage, but it is not what Stalin had. Malenkov rules by agreement of Molotov, Beria (secret police) and Bulganin (army), all of whom were only

COPENHAGEN, DENMARK-(P) A young Polish Air Force lieutenant who fled his Communist-dominated homeland in a Soviet-built MIG-15 jet fighter was believed enroute Thursday either to the United States or Canada.

The Justice Ministry announced Wednesday night that Lt. Franciszek Jarewski had left Denmark. At his own request, the ministry added, his destination would not be dis-

Jarewski, 21, landed the speedy jet on the Danish Baltic island of Bornholm March 5. He was recognized formally as a political refugee last Monday. 



"How do you ever have occasion to meet them?" the Germans ask. Then, once they have met, the Germans fear the "spoiled" American girls would never be content to spend a quiet evening talking

over a glass of wine. They believe the girls are "seeking thrills" and must have money

spent on them.

Here are a few reasons why German men men don't date American

(For accuracy, the interviews largely were obtained for Reporter-Telegram readers by a German reporter, Tino Reycharidt of a Munich publication At my request, he queried Germans on Why Don't You Date American

Girls" and here are a few answers): Ullrich Frodien, 30, dentist:-"The American girls wouldn't even look at us with our little earnings. I couldn't treat a girl as nicely as I'd like to because of financial rea-

Hanns Schramm, 38, streetcarconductor:-"I don't know how to get acquainted. They never go out

Rolf Gail, 26, reporter:-"I like our girls better. The American ladies act silly, seem to be always schizophrenic, and are so hysterically unrealistic about life."

Anton Schraps, 35, physician:-"I would love to do so, but remember that it is difficult for Germans to get in touch with Americans especially with girls. Moreover the poorest GI can furnish more money for a date than a German man will ever be able to."

Ludgwig Sperr. 31. editor:-"I dated American girls several times and was delighted by their looks, though they seem somehow arti-


