Moscow's New Peace Talk

The way not to get excited about a new Russian peace offensive is to count up the many that have been launched since the cold war began, and then reflect how little "peace" has come from them.

The latest efforts to prod the dove into flight have a little more imagination than most previous tries. The Soviet Union actually expressed regret over the death of British airmen shot down by Russian jets over Germany. And the Kremlin's propaganda recently conceded, for the first time since World War II, that Britain and France and the United States had something to do with the winning of that conflict.

But just because Moscow has put more thought into its newest offensive does not mean the maneuvers are any more sincere than before. Those who make a specialty of examining every word the Russians utter with an infrared camera, looking for hidden meanings, may find indeed that the Kremlin has more honorable intentions this time.

We never can overlook that possibility. But neither should we get our hopes up.

We must remember that the Russians can demonstrate their sincerity in an instant in half a dozen different ways. They have the regular diplomatic channels leading through their Washington embassy to our government. And they have that tattered old tent at Panmunjom, to which they could signal our truce officers in a matter of hours to grapple swiftly with the Korean war issue.






