



The test of Communist sincerity in the current Chinese bid for a Korean truce will come when real negotiating begins. All one can say now is that the tone and content of Premier Chou En-lai's offer suggest the Reds mean it this time.

If this is so, then why do they want a truce?

Clearly we of the West have not driven them to it. We do not have the Communists on the run in Korea or any active major battle front.

The reasons for the truce move therefore must lie

They could lie in Peiping. The Korean war is a drain on China (and Russia) no less than upon America and its allies. Mao may want out.

He also may have some fear of new offensives, either by UN forces in Korea or, later on, by Chiang Kai-shek's armies from Formosa against the Chinese mainland.
