





#### Total Blindness Attitude

The rapid deterioration of British-Egyptian relations over the Suez Canal has startled Western statesmen.

Reliable accounts from Cairo are that Premier Nagiub and other Egyptian leaders are totally preoccupied with just one thing: forcing British troops out of Suez.

Secretary of State Dulles is said to have heard little talk from them about Middle East defense arrangements. and slim appreciation of the canal's strategic value in the free world's defense.

That is exactly why Anglo-Egyptian negotiations on the issue have broken down. The Egyptians insist Britain agree to the withdrawal of its troops first, before any discussion is undertaken on protection of the vital British base at Suez.

The British, however, are unwilling to withdraw until they have assurance the base will be maintained, and made available to the West in the event of war.


