



#### Distorted History

Students of the Soviet Union marvel at the dexterity the Russians exhibit in rewriting history-not once but again and again—to suit their purposes of the moment.

This is a much more exhaustive process than many of us realize. If, for instance, Kremlin strategy requires an especially strong anti-American propaganda bent, you may find stripped from the history books all mention of Joseph Stalin praising the opening of a second front in World War II. You will read instead that on that memorable occasion the late premier said something totally dif-

Yet that isn't necessarily the end. The time might come when the Russians decide "friendship" with America is again a profitable course. Then Stalin's kind words might be resurrected, if any copies still exist.

Unhappily, the rewriting of history is not confined to the Soviet orbit. Men in Western nations practice it, too. The difference is that in the West these distortions never are consciously prepared as official government policy. They are dwelt upon by individuals, groups, elements in political parties.
