

The scrap metal industry—if you please -now has become so big that it is being given an antitrust investigation by the Federal Trade Commission. 





TOKYO -(AP)- Japan handed a sharp protest note to the Republic rea Monday night as it accused Korean policemen of firing on a Japanese coast guard patrol boat from a disputed islet midway between the two nations in the Sea of Japan.

The strong note from the foreign office threatened to tighten the already-strained relations between Japan and South Korea.

The note denounced what it called "ROK nationals' intrusion of Japanese territory and fishing in Japanese waters" and demanded payment for damage to the 450-ton Japanese coast guard boat Hekura. Japan also asked punishment of the Korean officials responsible and assurance the Sunday morning incident would not be repeated.

The rocky, uninhabited outcropping, Take Shima, has been claimed by both South Korea and Japan. It serves as a resting place for both Korean and Japanese fishermen and it lies in a good fishing area.

The reliability of the four-millionman Red Army to the Russian government, whoever heads that government, is well nigh perfect. No army in modern times, not even that of Nazi Germany, has been so well controlled. The Army is watched closely by the men who control the Communist Party. Dual Spy System

For the armed forces, there is a dual system of surveillance:

1. The political commissars, who have been attached to the Army since the early 1920's.

ganization of secret agents within MVD, the major function of which is internal security and counterintelligence.

The operations of the commissars are in the open. The commissars in a Russian Army unit is known to all officers and men. He is responsible to the party, receives his instructions from the Communist political chiefs and reports to them. His mission, in one respect, is something like that of the "information and education" officer in the U. S. Army: he explains political objectives of the government. Because he lives and serves with an Army unit, he also is in a position to know the talk and attitude of soldiers and to tell the party.

There have been reports that regular Army officers dislike and distrust the political commissars assigned o their units. But the same may not be true of the Russian GI. He has little daily contact with any commissioned officer He knows only the noncommissioned officers and the commissars. And he can appeal, as much as any Russian dares appeal an order, to the commissar.

Super-Secret Mission The agents of the MVD's Smersh operate in the utmost secrecy. They may be masquerading as either enlisted men or officers. Their sole mission is to detect defection in thought or action. Their methods of operation are ruthless even for the savage secret police of Russia.

These agents are especially congerned with troops that are or have n at posts where they had contact with the Western world, such as the occupation forces in Berlin.

In addition to the political comssars and secret agents within the Army, there is a large force of fledged and fully armed military but not within the structure of the regular Soviet Army. Their ob also is to keep control, but it includes supervision over civilian populations in Communist - controlled areas.


